ELDERS CORNER:

Nicaragua Mission – Part 3

One of the greatest blessings for me is being a part of the evangelism team. I get to go out each day, see the community we are working in, meet so many different people, and share the gospel of Jesus Christ with them. I'm so impressed with the caliber of the Nicaraguan preachers (and the evangelism translators – they are also members of the church) and their extensive knowledge of the scriptures. It doesn't seem to matter what situation we find ourselves in, they know the exact book, chapter and verse to go to in order to address it. There were 151 bible studies throughout the week and from those studies there were 8 baptisms and 4 restorations. One morning, our entire focus was visiting the unfaithful members from the El Rama congregation. The remainder of our time was spent methodically going home to home on every street in El Rama from the river to the top of the mountain. I wish I knew how many miles I walked. Almost everyone that you approached was willing to study for a few minutes to 2 hours. It didn't matter if they were a devout Catholic they still wanted to hear what you had to say. In the end their response may still be "I'm Catholic and will die a Catholic" but at least they heard the truth. What's fascinating is that in every study I participated in like that, they understood the difference in their religion and the Lord's church and knew that what we were saying was straight from the Bible and the truth, but it was simply too difficult for them to give up the religion of their life.

We ran into the typical gamut of religions, Catholic was the most prominent but there were those from the Church of God of Prophecy, Pentecostal, Jehovah Witness, and even a Mennonite. I didn't realize that there were Mennonites in Nicaragua but I was told there is a fairly large population in Bluefields which is a two-hour boat ride from El Rama.

I was greatly encouraged with one young lady that we studied with. She had two small children in diapers but she wrote down every single scripture that we used. She said she wanted to study for herself. There were at least 2 or 3 bible studies with her and I saw her and her babies at least one night of the gospel meeting. Hopefully the seeds sown will produce some fruit eventually. In another study on the mountain top, a woman wanted to be baptized. She had just had a baby 18 days prior and she was a little concerned that being baptized in the Rio Escondido might cause an infection but she said it was worth the risk. I witnessed my first "river baptism" and it truly was a sight to behold as she sank beneath the muddy waters and rose up a new sister in Christ.

Please pray for her and our 7 other new brothers and sisters in Christ that they will continue to remain faithful in the face of adversity. Pray also for the many we studied with who chose not to obey the gospel. May they eventually come to a fuller realization of the truth.

John 3:23 - Now John also was baptizing in Aenon near Salim, because there was much water there. And they came and were baptized.

Acts 8:35-38 – ³⁵ Then Philip opened his mouth, and beginning at this Scripture, preached Jesus to him. ³⁶ Now as they went down the road, they came to some water. And the eunuch said, "See, *here is* water. What hinders me from being baptized?" ³⁷ Then Philip said, "If you believe with all your heart, you may." And he answered and said, "I believe that Jesus Christ is the Son of God." ³⁸ So he commanded the chariot to stand still. And both Philip and the eunuch went down into the water, and he baptized him.
