WHEN PAUL WAS DEFEATED

Paul got the defeat of his life--not at Lystra, where he was stoned, for he built a church there; not at Corinth and Ephesus, where he was persecuted, for he successfully defended the cause of truth there; but at Athens, where no violence was shown, but where they were indifferent!

The spirit of indifference, or the lack of enthusiasm, has a paralyzing effect on noble efforts. If you desire to defeat the program of the local church, it isn't necessary for you to use violence or abusive words. Your indifference will do the job.

Neglect of sacred duty is a sin, a deadly sin, a damning sin. "To him therefore that knoweth to do good, and doeth it not, to him it is sin." (James 4:17)

"And Peter followed him afar off, even unto the palace of the high priest: and he sat with the servants, and warmed himself at the fire." Mark 14:54

As the Lord was being led away by the chief priests, scribes and elders to the high priest's palace, Peter followed afar off. Many of Jesus' disciples had fled, but Peter, even though he did not have the courage to stand with Jesus, followed to see what would be done with Him. Let's notice some of the results of Peter's following Christ afar off.

1- The comfort that Peter could have lendred to the Lord in this trying time was denied.

2- B ecause he didn't walk with Jesus, he was thrown into the company of His enemies. "He that is not with me is against me." (Mark 14:67-72)

3- Peter denied that he knew the Lord, even to the point of cursing and making an oath because of his fear of punishment. (Mark 14:72)

4-He was grieved because of his weakness (Mark 14:72)

Take a lesson from this unfortunate event, friends, and see the danger of your following Jesus afar off. DEB
