Article VII

"Slow and Steady Wins the Race"

Proverbs 21:5 teaches us a very important principle on saving and investing: "The plans of the diligent *lead* surely to plenty, But *those of* everyone *who is* hasty, surely to poverty" (NKJV). It is wise to save, as Proverbs 21:20 teaches: "There is desirable treasure, And oil in the dwelling of the wise, But a foolish man squanders it" (NKJV). Two examples in the Bible illustrate this slow and steady savings concept. Joseph saved during the seven years of prosperity to ensure that there was enough food during the seven years of famine. The little ant is another example of a wise and steady investor: "Go to the ant, you sluggard! Consider her ways and be wise, 7 Which, having no captain, Overseer or ruler,8 Provides her supplies in the summer, And gathers her food in the harvest. 9 How long will you slumber, O sluggard? When will you rise from your sleep? 10 A little sleep, a little slumber, A little folding of the hands to sleep—11 So shall your poverty come on you like a prowler, And your need like an armed man" (Proverbs 6:6-11, NKJV).

How, then, are we to save? There are two primary places to direct our savings: to the Lord and to ourselves. Our first check should be a gift to the Lord, and our second check should be a gift to ourselves ... week after week, month after month, year after year. "Slow and steady wins the race."
