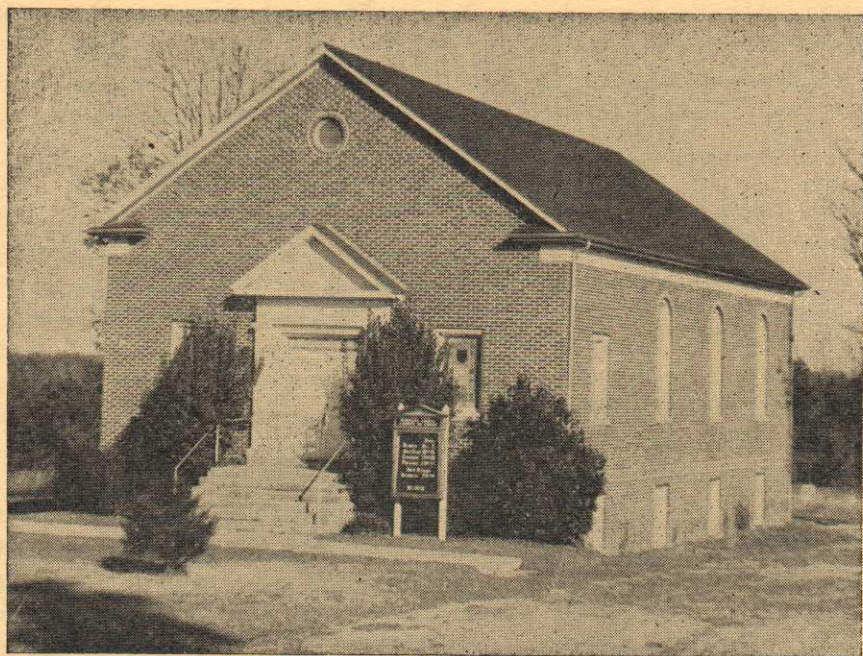

PRAISE.

1. Universal Praise of Jehovah.

Ye that fear the Lord, praise him; all ye the seed  
of Jacob, glorify him. Psm. 22:23.

Let the heaven and earth praise him, the seas and  
everything that moveth therein. Psm. 69:34.

Let every thing that hath breath praise the Lord.  
Psm. 150:6.

2. The Expression of Our Whole Being.

For God is the King of all the earth: sing ye praises  
with understanding. Psm. 47:7.

I will praise thee with my whole heart: before the  
gods will I sing praise unto thee. Psm. 138:1.

Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly in all wisdom; teaching and admonishing one another in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing with grace in your hearts to the Lord. Col. 3:16.

### 3. The Call for Praise.

Sing unto the Lord, O ye saints of his, and give thanks at the remembrance of his holiness. Psm. 30:4.

Sing, O heavens; and be joyful, O earth; and break forth into singing, O mountains: for the Lord has comforted his people, and will have mercy upon the afflicted. Isa. 49:13.

Every day will I bless thee; and I will praise thy name for ever and ever. Psm. 145:2.

By him therefore, let us offer the sacrifice of praise to God continually, that is, the fruit of our lips giving thanks to his name. Heb. 13:15.

### 5. Reasons for Praise.

a. The greatness of God. Praise him for his mighty acts: praise him according to his excellent greatness.

b. The goodness of God. Praise the Lord. O give thanks unto the Lord; for he is good: for his mercy endureth for ever. Psm. 106:1.

c. The salvation of God. Behold God is my salvation; I will trust and not be afraid: for the Lord JEHOVAH is my strength and my song; he also is become my salvation. Isa. 12:2.

d. For victory through Christ. But thanks be to God, who giveth us victory through our Lord Jesus Christ. 1 Cor. 15:57.

### PRAYER.

1. To be acceptable must be sincere.
