On October 20th and 21st Warners Chapel will be hosting a Financial Seminar sponsored by Freed-Hardeman University. On Saturday morning there will be a ½ day seminar led by brother Kyle Lamb. Kyle is a native of Southern Indiana and graduated from Freed-Hardeman University with business finance degree in 2000 and an MBA in 2011. He is a Certified Financial Planner and has spent most of his career specializing in providing financial planning services to alumni and friends of Freed-Hardeman University. He also spent two years working as a financial advisor for a large brokerage firm. He is currently the Assistant Vice-President for Regional Development at Freed-Hardeman University, where he leads the office in structuring financial planning techniques and strategies to meet the needs and desires of donors, alumni and friends of the university.

This seminar is free and nothing is being sold. We also hope to have a financial aid representative from Freed-Hardeman to assist in how to pay for college. In the afternoon, there will be 5 one hour private counseling sessions offered to help families with their individual financial planning. A signup sheet will be placed on the bulletin board. Article I

Contentment or Complacency?

The first issue that must be examined when dealing with the management of our money is our level of contentment. Content is defined as being satisfied enough with what one has or is; not desiring something more. Contentment should not be confused with complacency, which is quiet satisfaction, gratification, self-satisfaction or smugness. We are to be content with what we have but never complacent.

Paul writes in Philippians 4:11-13, "**11** Not that I speak in regard to need, for I have learned in whatever state I am, to be content: **12** I know how to be abased, and I know how to abound. Everywhere and in all things I have learned both to be full and to be hungry, both to abound and to suffer need. **13** I can do all things through Christ who strengthens me." (NKJV). Paul reminds us that the art of contentment is learned and that we are not simply born being content.
