Invite Your Enemies

One hundred and twenty thousand people lived in the city of Nineveh in the days of Jonah (Jonah 4:11). The Bible, archaeology, and history show us this was a great city at that time (Jonah 1:2). Beautiful parks and buildings well laid out are just a few of the things that made Nineveh a great city. However, the people of Nineveh served Ishtar, the goddess of war and passion. As a result, they had become very wicked (Jonah 1:2). They were going to have to change or God was going to destroy them (Jonah 3:4).

God commanded Jonah to go to Nineveh and warn them of the coming condemnation and destruction (Jonah 1:1-2; 3:1-4). If Nineveh would repent then God would relent (Jonah 3:10). Jonah did not want to go to Nineveh. We don't have to guess as to the reason why he didn't want to go. The text makes it all very clear (Jonah 3:10-4:4). Jonah didn't want to go and preach to the people of Nineveh because he didn't want them to be spared. He wanted them to be destroyed. He was concerned they might listen to God's message, repent, and then be saved. It isn't often a prophet of God would rather see people condemned.

Jonah chose to run away from his responsibility to preach to the people of Nineveh. He had made his plans and boarded the boat bound for Tarshish (Jonah 1:3). He was trying to get as far away from Nineveh as he could, but along the way to Tarshish he learned it is not possible to hide from God. A terrible storm hit Jonah's ship while it was headed west on the Mediterranean Sea. Jonah told the sailors he served the God of heaven who made land and sea, and that he needed to be thrown overboard because he was attempting to run from God. The sailors did not want to do this to Jonah and tried to row to shore. Failing in this effort they finally decided to throw him overboard, though they did so with much remorse (Jonah 1:14-15).

God had a special fish waiting for Jonah (Jonah 1:17). This one was particularly prepared for the occasion. It was one by which Jonah could be swallowed, and in which Jonah could survive

for a few days. Jonah was three days and three nights in the belly of the fish. During this time he prayed fervently to God (Jonah 2:1-2). Jonah describes the sensation of the deep closing around him as he was tangled up in seaweed. He felt as though he were going down to the moorings of the mountains and the earth was closing him up behind bars forever (Jonah 2:3-6). Jonah's soul fainted inside of him and his prayer went up to God (John 2:7). He had been humbled by God. Whenever God humbles someone it is painful. In answer to Jonah's prayers, the LORD spoke to the fish and it vomited Jonah out onto dry land. One can only imagine the slime, stench, and filth that surrounded Jonah. How relieved he must have been to breath fresh air, feel firm ground beneath him, and to see the sky again.

God told Jonah again to go and preach to Nineveh. Jonah went, and much to his discouragement the people actually listened. He wanted them to be destroyed. That is why he tried to run from God. But the Bible says, "the people of Nineveh believed God, proclaimed a fast, and put on sack-cloth, from the greatest of them to the least of them (Jonah 3:5)." God chose not to send disaster upon this city as a response to their repentance (Jonah 3:10). Jonah was angry and asked God to kill him because he would rather die than see the people of Nineveh spared (Jonah4:1-3).

Jonah decided to set up a shelter outside the city and watch to see what might happen to it (John 4:5). God prepared a plant to grow up over Jonah's shelter to provide him with some much needed shade. Jonah had been miserable in the heat and sun, so the shade from the plant was much appreciated. The very next day, God caused the plant to wither and prepared a strong east wind on a hot sunny day causing Jonah to feel very weak. Jonah once again pitched a tantrum and told God he would rather die. God then questioned Jonah about his anger over the loss of the shade plant, and said Jonah had pity on a plant, but would not take pity on a city of more than one hundred and twenty thousand people (Jonah 4:6-11).

Jonah seemed to really hate his enemies. He did not want them to be spared so he didn't want to preach to them. We must love our enemies (Matthew 5:43-48). Loving our enemies may provide opportunities for us to introduce them to the saving Gospel message of Jesus Christ. Jesus died for His enemies. Perhaps we can give our enemies the opportunity to hear the Gospel. Invite your friends and relatives to the Gospel meeting this week, and if you have any enemies, consider inviting them too.
