GETTING DRUNK: PART 2

Review

Last week we looked at the Greek word "methusko" (methuskesthe) which is translated, "drunk" in Ephesians 5:18.(1) We noted sources that identified "methusko" as an aorist, inceptive, ingressive verb.(2) In other words, it is a verb that includes the entire process with primary focus on the beginning of the process.(3)

Objection Considered

Consider now an objection concerning the argument presented above. *The King James Version* translates Ephesians 5:18 as follows: "And be not drunk with wine, wherein is excess; but be filled with the Spirit." It has been argued by some that the word "excess" refers to the amount of alcohol in question. From this they conclude that the amount of alcohol forbidden by Ephesians 5:18 is an excessive amount. There are two problems with this argument. First, the argument does not address the definition of "methusko" as an aorist, inceptive, ingressive verb. The evidence regarding the fact that "methusko" includes the entire process with primary focus on the beginning of the process is not negated. Second, the word "excess" does not refer to the amount of alcohol taken in but rather the fact that drinking alcohol is bad behavior. *The American Standard Version* reads, "And be not drunken with wine, wherein is riot . . ." Though "excess" is not an incorrect translation, the word "riot" points more directly to the correct meaning. Drinking alcohol is riotous behavior. How much does one have to drink before the drinking is considered riotous? The inceptive, ingressive of "drunk" tells us it is "riotous" behavior from the beginning. It is wrong behavior throughout the process.

Be Sober

The drinking of alcohol is forbidden in the negative form (don't begin the process of getting drunk) by the command in Ephesians 5:18. We should also consider the fact that the drinking of alcohol is forbidden in the positive form (do be sober). I Thessalonians 5:6, 7 is as follows: "Therefore let us not sleep, as others do, but let us watch and be sober. For those who sleep, sleep at night, and those who get drunk are drunk at night." Notice command to "watch and be sober. The word "watch" is contrasted with "sleep," and the word "sober" is contrasted with "drunk". Thus the context proves the command to be sober is with reference to abstinence from

alcohol. *The enhanced Strong's Dictionary* shows us "sober" is a translation of the Greek word "nepho".(4) "Nepho" is defined as "to abstain from wine (keep sober), i.e. (figuratively) be discreet: - be sober, watch."(5) The literal meaning of the word is "to abstain from wine." The context indicates the discussion here is to be taken literally because "sober" is contrasted with "drunk". Therefore, we have the command to abstain from

alcohol. *The enhanced Strong's Dictionary* shows us "sober" is a translation of the Greek word "nepho". (4) "Nepho" is defined as "to abstain from wine (keep sober), i.e. (figuratively) be discreet: - be sober, watch." (5) The literal meaning of the word is "to abstain from wine." The context indicates the discussion here is to be taken literally because "sober" is contrasted with "drunk". Therefore, we have the command to abstain from wine given to us in 1 Thessalonians 5:6.

This argument is further reinforced by *The Expanded Vine's Expository Dictionary of New Testament Words*. This dictionary says "nepho signifies to be free from the influence of intoxicants." (6) *The Analytical Greek Lexicon Revised*, defines "nepho" as "to be sober, not intoxicated; in N.T. met. to be vigilant, circumspect." (7) This lexicon also defines "nephalios" as "sober, temperate, abstinent in respect to wine, etc.; in N.T. met vigilant, circumspect." (8) *The New Thayer's Greek-English Lexicon* gives a similar definition. (9) The dictionary and lexicons just mentioned give the meaning of being free from intoxicants as the primary definition. However, they do suggest a metaphorical use of the term. Yet the fact that 1 Thessalonians 5:6 uses the word "nepho" (nephomen)(10) in contrast with "methusko" (1 Thessalonians 5:7) shows that the primary use of the term "nepho" is correct. In other words, the fact that being sober is contrasted with being drunk indicates a discussion of intoxicants.

We should also note that W. E. Vine, (11) A. T. Robertson(12) and others say the word "methusko" in 1 Thessalonians 5:7 is inceptive and ingressive just as it is in Ephesians 5:18. Verse six says "be sober" (nepho) in contrast to those who "get drunk" (methsuko) in verse seven. In other words, we should be sober rather than being like those who engage in the process of getting drunk.
