BLASPHEMY OF THE HOLY SPIRIT (Pt. 3 of 4)

This theory ["can't sin today" view] presents some strange implications to the atonement of Jesus. The sins of those who died before the death of Christ on the cross who were obedient to God were pretermitted, i.e., passed along or postponed until the ultimate atoning sacrifice was offered. If these Pharisees were guilty of blaspheming the Holy Spirit and were later present on the day of Pentecost and heard Peter's sermon, Peter's words would not include them. "Repent, and let every one [that is, except those who have blasphemed the Holy Spirit. pek] of you be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ for the remission of sins; and you shall receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. Another implication is that Jesus blood was limited [or one may say selective] in its scope of redemptive power. This would certainly weaken John's statement concerning atonement and advocacy: "And He Himself is the propitation for our sins, and not for ours only but also for the whole world." (1 John 2:2), the whole world, that is, except for those who have blasphemed the Holy Spirit.

This theory also has implications concerning John 3:16: "For God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have everlasting life." Does this "whoever" also exclude those who have blasphemed the Holy Spirit? Could there have been any at Ephesus who had blasphemed the Holy Spirit before the death of Christ? If so, they would be excluded by Paul's statement, "(Eph 1:7) In Him we have redemption through His blood, the forgiveness of sins, according to the riches of His grace." How inclusive is the term "all?" Would those who had committed the sin of blasphemy against the Holy Spirit be forgiven from "all" [cf. 1Jn. 5:17; 1:9] unrighteousness? These proponents of this erroneous theory would have to answer "no, they would not." To blaspheme means to "speak against" or "reject." Man can, and does blaspheme the Holy Spirit today.

OUR NEW MINISTER

Frank and I have maintained a close friendship for twenty-five years. I know him very well and we have shared hundreds of conversations about our work. If he started a sentence, I could probably finish it. Frank is a diligent student of God's word and is well read in other areas. He has a compassionate personality and has been a great friend to me in listening to the cares of my world. Frank has worked in two churches in the capacity that he will work here. He knows his role and the work required of him.

Jane, Frank's wife, has always been a warm and hospitable person. She has been supportive of her husband and has a quiet spirit.
