SERMON ON THE MOUNT (VI)

"Again, ye have heard that it was said to them of old time, Thou shalt not forswear thyself, but shall perform unto the Lord thine oaths: but I say unto you, Swear not at all; neither by the heaven, for it is the throne of God; nor by the earth, for it is the footstool of his feet; nor by Jerusalem, for it is the city of the great King. Neither shalt thou swear by thy head, for thou canst not make one hair white or black. But let your speech be, Yea, yea; Nay, nay: and whatsoever is more than these is of the evil one." - - Matt. 5:33-37

Again Jesus refers to another part of the law of Moses that the Jews were perverting. They had maintained that no oath was binding unless the name of God was included in it. If one swore by heaven, or earth, or his head, or by Jerusalem, etc., he was not bound to perform his oath-- so they taught.

In verse 37, Jesus gives us the rule of a Christian's speech. He says, "let your speech be Yea, yea; Nay, nay." The Christian's life must be such that others will accept what he says as the truth, without the making of an oath.

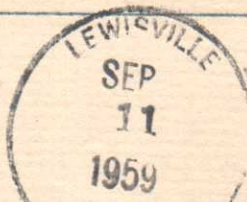
