HOW LONG

The souls of the martyred saints in the book of Revelation "cried with a loud voice, saying, "how long, O Lord, holy and true, until You judge and avenge our blood on those who dwell on the earth?" (Revelation 6:10) Their plea for revenge was legitimate. The book of Revelation shows us that God would soon avenge those martyred saints (Revelation 1:1-3; 22:6-10, 20).

Many Christians today are crying out "How Long!" They are not asking how long it will be until persecuted Christians are avenged. They are asking how long it will be until the sermon is over. Perhaps the pew is too uncomfortable, or maybe they just think they have better things to do than worship God. Perhaps they are hungry and want to go eat. Jesus put off the partaking of physical food for the sake of spiritual food (John 4). But, I suppose that is too much for us to do.

I have preached in six different countries. In most overseas congregations where I have worshipped, the length of the sermon has never been an issue. Christians travel for miles in order to worship God and fully intend to get as much as they can when they get there. I have seen our African brethren sit on concrete slabs listening to preachers take turns preaching. This often goes on for hours before someone will decide it is time to get something to eat. But our brethren in America cry "how long" when the preacher goes past 35 minutes. We sit in a movie theatre for two hours, sit at a ball game for three hours, but can't sit in worship for one hour.

Don't get me wrong. I am not for artificially extending the worship service or a sermon just to prove something about being more pious than other people. The Lord condemned such artificial extensions (Mark 12:40). I have written in my preacher's training book concerning the importance of "saying as much as you can with as few words as possible." I don't believe in flabby sermons that contain more information than is necessary. Furthermore, I seldom preach more than thirty minutes and often just a little over twenty minutes. I also believe in preachers following time limits when they are on a lectureship program or something similar. I am a firm believer in the idea that it is better to stop when they are hungry for more, than it is to go on when they wish you would have quit minutes ago.

And yet, there are subjects which take more than twenty minutes to develop. There are preachers who can hold people's attention for more than thirty minutes. Also, there are appropriate times for preaching longer. Many times our visiting preachers need 45 minutes to properly develop the material. How shallow, weak, and sad when Christians today cry out. "how long," when an excellent and powerful sermon has taken 45 minutes to develop. What a contrast with those who cried out "how long" will the church continue to be persecuted (Revelation 6:10).
