BAPTISM DOESN'T DO ANY GOOD (Part 4)

IF IT IS NOT AN IMMERSION

- A. Romans 6:4 Therefore we are buried with him by baptism into death: that like as Christ was raised up from the dead by the glory of the Father, even so we also should walk in newness of life.
- B. Many advocate that one can be baptized by sprinkling, pouring, OR immersion.
- C. The Bible does not give such options, but calls baptism a burial. Colossians 2:12 Buried with him in baptism, wherein also ye are risen with him through the faith of the operation of God, who hath raised him from the dead.
- D. It requires going down into the water. Acts 8:38 And he commanded the chariot to stand still: and they went down both into the water, both Philip and the eunuch; and he baptized him. E. The word "Baptism" literally means, "to dip, plunge, or submerge."
- F. If one was not immersed, then his "baptism" did no good.

- If it is not followed by faithful Christian living.

 A. Acts 2:41-42 Then they that gladly received his word were baptized: and the same day there were added unto them about three thousand souls. 42 And they continued stedfastly in the apostles' doctrine and fellowship, and in breaking of bread, and in prayers.
- B. Occasionally, a person is baptized and never darkens the building's door again. Mt. 19:16-22 Now behold, one came and said to Him, "Good Teacher, what good thing shall I do that I may have eternal life?" So he said to him, "Why do you call Me good? No one is good but One, that is, God. But if you want to enter into life, keep the commandments." He said to Him, "Which ones?" Jesus said, "'YOU SHALL NOT MURDER,' 'YOU SHALL NOT COMMIT ADULTERY,' 'YOU SHALL NOT STEAL,' 'YOU SHALL NOT BEAR FALSE WITNESS,' 'HONOR YOUR FATHER AND YOUR MOTHER,' AND, 'YOU SHALL LOVE YOUR NEIGHBOR AS YOURSELF.' "The young man said to Him, "All these things I have kept from my youth. What do I still lack?" Jesus said to him, "If you want to be perfect, go, sell what you have and give to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven; and come, follow Me." But when the young man heard that saying, he went away sorrowful, for he had great possessions.
- C. Some come for a time then fall away. Matthew 21:28-30 But what think ye? A certain man had two sons; and he came to the first, and said, Son, go work to day in my vineyard. 29 He answered and said, I will not; but afterward he repented, and went. 30 And he came to the second, and said likewise. And he answered and said, I go, sir: and went not.
- D. Others may continue to attend services, but their lives mirror the world instead of the image of Christ. Romans 12:1-2 I beseech you therefore, brethren, by the mercies of God, that ye present your bodies a living sacrifice, holy, acceptable unto God, which is your reasonable service. 2 And be not conformed to this world: but be ye transformed by the renewing of your mind, that ye may prove what is that good, and acceptable, and perfect, will of God.
- E. In each of these cases, baptism did not really do any good because ultimately (without repentance) they will be lost.

ELDERS CORNER:

FEELING SAVED

- **Q.** I believe I'm saved; in fact, I'm sure I am; I feel it deep inside, so why all the fuss about biblical confirmation of it?
- **A.** Just as a computer will produce its output based only on its programming, so we tend to do. Terrorists who are convicted enough to kill innocent victims are still wrong; those who routinely kill unborn babies are still wrong despite feeling justified (Proverbs 6:16-19).

Saul of Tarsus, an extremely devout and well-educated religious man of the first century, was so convicted that Christianity was pagan that he became a Christian-killer, later stating: "I verily thought with myself, that I ought to do many things contrary to the name of Jesus of Nazareth. Which thing I also did in Jerusalem: and many of the saints did I shut up in prison ... and when they were put to death, I gave my voice against them. And I punished them oft ... and compelled them to blaspheme; and being exceedingly made against them, I persecuted them even unto strange cities" (Acts 26:9-11). He was so "zealous toward God" that he persecuted Christians, "unto the death, binding and delivering into prisons both men and women" (Acts 22:3-4; cf. Acts 7:57-8-3).

But his zealousness and convictions were completely contrary to God's will because they were not based on a knowledge of and obedience to God's truth (Romans 10:1-3; Acts 22:1-16).

What we "Think" or "feel" simply will not save us on Judgment Day, if it is not accurately and obediently in accordance with God's Word, which will be the only basis of our judgment (John 12:48).

If we are truly saved, then why not study God's word to simply confirm it? If the study of God's Word alone reveals that we are not, it will surely show us what is lacking so we can correct it. Either way we win! Let us study only what God has to say.

IS YOUR BIBLE RED?

A preacher once observed in a sermon that every Christian should own a "red" Bible. At least that was what people heard. He actually said, "Every Christian should own a 'read' Bible." Regardless of the color, it should be well-worn by the constant study of its owner. It is amazing how little people know about the Word in this generation, even in a land with full access to the Bible (electronic, apps, websites). Tonight Show host Jay Leno frequently does man-on-the street interviews. One night he collared some young people to ask them questions about the Bible.

"Can you name one of the Ten Commandments" he asked two college-age women. One replied "Freedom of Speech?" He said to the other, "Complete this sentence: Let he who is without sin ..." Her response was, "Have a good time?" Leno turned to a young man, and asked, "Who according to the Bible, was eaten by a whale?" The confident answer was, "Pinocchio."

Such misunderstandings are both humorous and tragic. Make time for Bible study in your life! "How shall they believe in him of whom they have not heard?" (Romans 10:14)
