## OUR SONG SERVICE

Here are a few rules that might help us in our song service. Why don't we all try them:

1. **GET THERE ON TIME AND GET SEATED!** We don't "Lord's Supper" them in, why "sing", them in? One is just as much a part of the worship as the other.
2. **DON'T WALK IN DURING A SONG!** We don't walk in during a verbal prayer, why do so when one is set to music? Walking in and disturbing the people during a song is just as irreverent as doing so when Bro. X is leading a prayer. If not, why not?
3. **STAY WITH THE LEADER!** His business is to lead. Ours is to follow. Let's not make ourselves conspicuous by "hanging on" after the leader has stopped, or by running ahead.
4. **SIT UP!** We can't sing slouched down in our seats.
5. **OPEN YOUR MOUTH!** Wider, ~~WIDER~~, WIDER, that's it—now we can understand what you're singing.
6. **THINK ABOUT THE WORDS!** This is where the good is in singing. Singing without putting our hearts into it is hypocrisy. Matt. 15:7-8.

Now let's all try these from now on and let's see if our song service isn't better.
