"WELL, WE BAPTIZE TOO."

Denominational churches have a loose and varied interpretation of baptism. They generally acknowledge that baptism is a Bible subject and that those who profess to be followers of Christ should be baptized. They do not generally agree as to the purpose of baptism, how the act is to be administered or who may be a proper subject of baptism.

Most denominational churches administer baptism to their communicants in some form or fashion; for some reason or the other. Frequently, people in denominational churches begin to investigate the truth of God and become aware of the fact that they are not living in accord with that revealed truth. They now realize they are members of a manmade, man-orientated church and largely guided by man-made creeds and disciplines. They learn of the one church and then come to face the truth of the one baptism (Ephesians 4:4-6). They soon reject their former baptism, or that which they understood to be baptism, and are immersed into Christ for the remission of sins. The denominational concept of baptism is wrong. Here are some reasons why one should reject denominational Baptism.

1. None hold that baptism is absolutely essential to salvation. Some go as far as to say that baptism is a command, but a command one doesn't have to obey. In answer to this we must agree that baptism is a command (Matt. 28:19: Acts 2:38; 10:48) and for one to be saved he must render obedience to divine commands. Jesus is Savior only to those who obey him (Hebrews 5: 9)

2. Baptism follows salvation. Many have made the statement "I believe that God, for Christ's sake, has pardoned my sins." If the statement is true then baptism couldn't be for the remission of sins, would not wash away sins, as God, for Christ's sake, had already saved one from his past sins. However, the Scriptures teach baptism is for the remission of sins (Acts 2:38), it washes away sins (Acts 22; 16) and baptism saves (I Peter 3:21).

3. Baptism is the act by which an already saved person then joins the church. Denominationalists declare the church to be a non-essential entity as far as salvation is concerned. Hence, baptism is a non-essential act to get into a non-essential organization. The New Testament does not record one single instance of anyone joining the church.

4. Sprinkling or pouring are not in the Scriptural sense baptism. The best English dictionaries define baptism: to dip or immerse in water or to pour or sprinkle water upon as a religious rite. This is how the word is used in modern-day English. However, the word baptism has no such connotation in the original Greek of the New Testament. The Greek word baptidzo is anglicized: baptize. In Koine Greek, the action depicts one who is buried, submerged, or immersed.

Denominational baptism stands for disorder and confusion, nothing more.

Elders Corner:

Is Illness the Result of Sin?

God placed Adam and Eve in a perfect environment in Eden. He put them into the Garden of Eden to dress it and to keep it, saying, "Of every tree of the garden thou mayest freely eat: but of the tree of knowledge of good and evil, thou shalt not eat of it: for in the day that thou eatest thereof thou shalt surely die" (Genesis 2:15-17). Adam and Eve had everything needed for perfect health, but when they sinned, corruption, including illness, entered the world.

God told Eve, "I will greatly multiply thy sorrow and they conception; in sorrow thou shalt bring forth children". And to Adam He said, "Because thou hast hearkened unto the voice of thy wife, and hast eaten of the tree, of which I commanded thee, saying, Thou shalt not eat of it: cursed is the ground for thy sake; in sorrow shalt thou eat of it all the days of thy life; thorns also an thistles shall it bring forth to thee; and thou shalt eat the herb of the field; in the sweat of thy face shalt thou eat bread, till thou return unto the ground" (Genesis 3:16-19).

Adam and Eve, our ancestors, were perfect in health until their fall, but since then mankind has been subject to all sorts of maladies. When the lost access to the tree of life in the Garden, they died spiritually, and their bodies began to decay. Sin brought all these consequences into the world.

It is not the case, however, that everyone who experiences an illness does so because of his or her personal sin. Certainly many lifestyle choices open us up to disease and illness, but many illnesses come upon us despite our best efforts to live healthily and faithfully to God.

"And as Jesus passed by, he saw a man which was blind from his birth. And his disciples asked him, saying, Master, who did sin, this man, or his parents, that he was born blind?" (John 9:1-2) The disciples expressed a common misconception of the day—that all illness, and especially one as serious as blindness, resulted from sin. But Jesus answered, "Neither hath this man sinned, nor his parents; but the works of God should be made manifest in him" (John 9:3). After Jesus healed him, he worshipped Jesus as God's Son (John 9:35-38).

Jesus, the Great Physician, has prepared a place for his servants (John 14:1-5) where illness will be no more. "And God shall wipe away all tears from their eyes; and there shall be no more death, neither sorrow, nor crying, neither shall there be any more pain; for the former things are passed away" (Rev. 21:4). There will be no need for hospitals in heaven, because all that was listed in the fall of man will be restored. Having obeyed Christ, we will be forgiven of our sins, and we will live eternally in the presence of the Lord.
