Plucking the Strings of the Heart

We surely love the souls of those whom God loves. The Bible says, "For this is good and acceptable in the sight of God our Savior, who desires all men to be saved and to come to the knowledge of truth (2 Timothy 2:3-4)." The Bible also teaches us that God "is long-suffering toward us, not wiling that any should perish but that all should come to repentance (2 Peter 3:9)." The love of God for all people is implied in each of the above verses by the fact that God wants all people to be saved. But, in each verse there are qualifications given regarding that salvation. In 2 Timothy 2:3-4 we see that for one to be saved he must come to a knowledge of truth. In 2 Peter 3:9 we see that for one to be saved he must come to repentance. Repentance is a turning around, that is, a change in direction. We must change direction away from that which is not true, toward that which is true.

We love the souls of our denominational friends, family members, and neighbors just as God does. It is because of that love for them that we must continue to point them in the direction of truth. God is long-suffering toward them and we must be also. But God requires repentance in accordance with the truth and so we must tell the truth. We must encourage our friends and neighbors to consider pre-denominational Christianity. We must encourage them to look at the New Testament to see what Christianity was like before the development of so many different denominations. Jesus Christ is the head of the church and He has given us the New Testament as the standard of authority for Christianity (Colossians 1:14-18; Hebrews 9).

With that in mind let us consider an interesting change in worship that occurred as the Lord delivered His New Covenant for the church. There are, in fact, many changes between the worship of the Law and the Prophets and the worship of the New Testament church But, perhaps the most distinct is the use of instruments in worship to God. This is not to suggest that instruments were always used in worship to God under the Law of Moses. However, the Psalms contains many references to the use of instruments for those living under the Law of Moses (Psalm 33:1-3; 81:1-2; 147:9; 150:1-6). Also, the priests sang and played on instruments in worship to God when the ark was brought into the temple (2 Chronicles 5:11-14).

It is important to question why there are examples and commands to sing with man-made instruments under the Law of Moses, but there are no examples or commands for Christians singing with man-made instruments in worship to God in the church here on earth. To answer this question let us briefly consider the use of the Greek word "psallo," as it is found in the Greek translation of the Hebrew Old Testament (The Septuagint, or. LXX), and the Greek New Testament. The Greek "psallo" is often used to translate the Hebrew, "zamar," which is defined by Brown/Driver/Briggs', Hebrew ad English Lexicon of the Old Testament, as "make music in praise to God." At times "psallo" in the Septuagint translates "zamar" in the context of singing only, and at other times in the context of singing with an instrument. When an instrument is used "The Greek construction in each instance is psallo followed by the preposition en ('with' or 'on') and the name of the instrument (A capella Music, Everett Ferguson, p. 5)." We see this grammatical structure in Ephesians 5:19 thus showing us that God "has specified the instrument on which the melody is to be made, namely the heart (Ferguson, 16)."

God is very specific in Ephesians 5:19. He is telling us to sing and He is telling us which instrument He wants us to use. The instrument He tells Christians to use in singing songs of praise is not one created by people, but rather one created by Him. It is the heart. The fact that God specifically tell us to use the heart as the instrument to accompany our singing eliminate all authority for the use of any other instrument. For this reason Christians should always sing without man-made instruments when worshipping God, and let us always sing with the God-created instrument specified in the text, that is, the heart.
