"AS SOON AS THEY ARE BORN"

David, King of Israel wrote many Psalms. These Psalms were set to music and sung by the Jews in ancient times. The Psalms are written in poetic form, and as such often contain exaggerations for the sake of emphasis. Consider Psalm 58:3 as an example. David wrote, "The wicked are estranged from the womb; they go astray as soon as they are born, speaking lies." Since when are babies born speaking lies? A newborn baby cannot even speak. Clearly David is poetically emphasizing the wickedness of some men by exaggerating concerning their sin. They are so wicked it is just as if they have been lying from the time they are born.

When David was rebuked by Nathan for the adulterous affair with Bathsheba, David felt horrible. David became very grieved by the sin he had committed. In guilty agony over his sin and the terrible consequences of his sin, he wrote Psalm 51. It is in this Psalm that David begged for mercy from God. It is here that David exaggerated his sinful condition in order to emphasize the great remorse he felt. In the course of this Psalm David wrote, "Behold, I was brought forth in iniquity, and in sin my mother conceived me." (Psalm 51:5) David is not saying that he was actually born with the guilt of sin inherited from his father. No such thing is said in the text. David is simply exaggerating the guilt he endured for the sin he had committed with Bathsheba. He felt so bad it was just as if he had been "brought forth in iniquity".

To give further evidence of the poetic and figurative nature of the text, take note of Psalm 51:8. There David refers to his bones as having been broken by God. God did not literally break David's bones, but that is the way David felt. David was emotionally broken down by the guilt of his sin. He was in agony over what he had done. In a context which is clearly poetic one should not be too hasty to take David's comments in verse five in a literal fashion.

God did not create the spirits of babies to bear the guilt of their father's sins. In fact, God specifically said, "The son shall not bear the guilt of the father". (Ezekiel 18:20) To interpret Psalm 51:5 in such a way as to contradict this clear statement is to interpret that passage incorrectly. David was not born in sin. He did not bear the guilt of his father's sin. David was simply writing concerning the excruciating spiritual and emotional pain he felt over the sin which he committed as a grown man.

In Matthew 18:3 Jesus told us we must become as little children in order to enter the kingdom of God. One enters the kingdom of God when he is baptized (Acts 2:41-47); Galatians 3:27). When one is baptized his sins are taken away (Acts 22:16; Acts 2:38). We enter the kingdom without sin. In that condition we are like the little children. Little children are not born with sin. Sin is a transgression of God's law (1 John 3:4). What little baby has transgressed God's law while still in the womb so that he is born with sin? There is not one that has. Babies are innocent and pure.
