In George Washington's day there were no cameras or "smart phones." One's image was either sculpted or painted. Some paintings of Washington show him standing behind a desk with one arm behind his back while others show both arms and both legs.

Prices charged by painters were not based on how many people were to be painted but by how many limbs were to be painted. Arms and legs are "limbs" so painting them would cost the buyer more. Hence, the expression, "Okay, but it will cost you an arm and a leg."

The Bible says, "And if your right hand causes you to sin, cut it off and cast it from you: for it is more profitable for you that one of your members perish than for your whole body to be cast into hell." Matthew 5:30.
