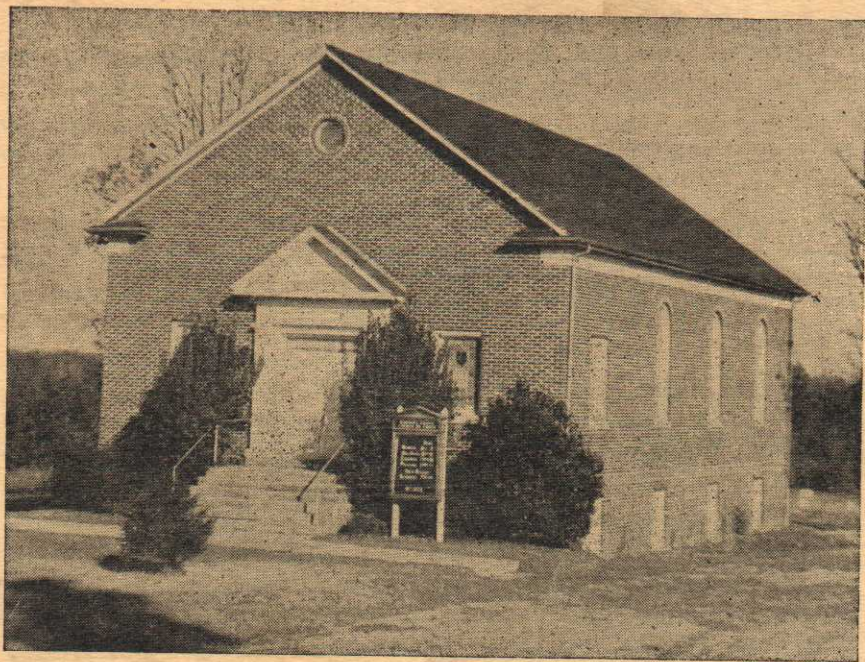

Purity of the Church

"This I say then, Walk in the Spirit, and ye shall not fulfil the lust of the flesh. For the flesh lusteth against the Spirit, and the Spirit against the flesh: and these are contrary the one to the other: so that ye can not do the things that ye would. But if ye be led of the spirit, ye are not under the law. Now the works of the flesh are manifest, which are these; Adultery, fornication, uncleanness, lasciviousness, Idolatry, witchcraft, hatred, variance, emulations, wrath, strife, seditions, heresies, Envyings, murders, drunkenness, revellings, and such like: of the which I tell you before, as I have told you in time past, that they which do such things shall not inherit the kingdom of God. But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, longsuffering, gentleness, goodness, faith, meekness, temperance: aga

inst such there is no law. And they that are Christ's have crucified the flesh with the affections and lusts (Gal. 5: 16-24) God requires of all his people: "Having therefore these promises, dearly beloved, let us cleanse ourselves from all filthiness of the flesh and spirit, perfecting holiness in the fear of God." (2 Cor. 7:1) The church should be pure in: DOCTRINE. "In all things shewing thyself a pattern of good works: In doctrine shewing uncorruptness, gravity, sincerity sound speech,—that he that is of the contrary part may be ashamed, having no evil thing to say of you." (Titus 2:7&8.) HEART. "Blessed are the pure in heart; for they shall see God." (Matt. 5:8) SPEECH. "Let no corrupt communication proceed out of your mouth, but that which is good to the use of edifying, that it may minister grace unto the hearers." (Eph. 4:29) CONDUCT. Dearly beloved, I beseech you as strangers and pilgrims, abstain from fleshly lusts, which war against the soul." (1Pet. 2:11) "For the time will come when they will not endure sound doctrine; but after their own lusts shall they heap to themselves teachers, having itching ears; And they shall turn away their ears from the truth, and shall be turned unto fables." (2Tim. 4:3,4) Here are some doctrines that the Scriptures condemn: BALAAM. "But I have a few things against thee, because thou hast there them that hold the doctrine of Balaam, who taught Balac to cast a stumblingblock before the children of Israel, to eat things sacrificed unto idols, and to commit fornication." (Rev. 2:14) NICOLAITANS. "Sohast thou also them that hold the doctrine of the Nicolaitans, which thing I hate." (Rev. 2:15) DEVILS. "Now the Spirit speaketh expressly, that in the latter times some shall depart from the faith, giving heed to seducing spirits, and doctrines of devils;" (1Tim. 4:1) MEN. "But in vain they do worship me, teaching for doctrine the commandments of men." (Matt. 15:9) "Pure religion and undefiled before God and the Father is this, To visit the fatherless and widows in their affliction, and to keep himself unspotted from the world." (James 1:27) It is always good to: "Let your speech be always with grace, seasoned with salt, that ye may know how ye ought to answer every man." (Col 4:6)
