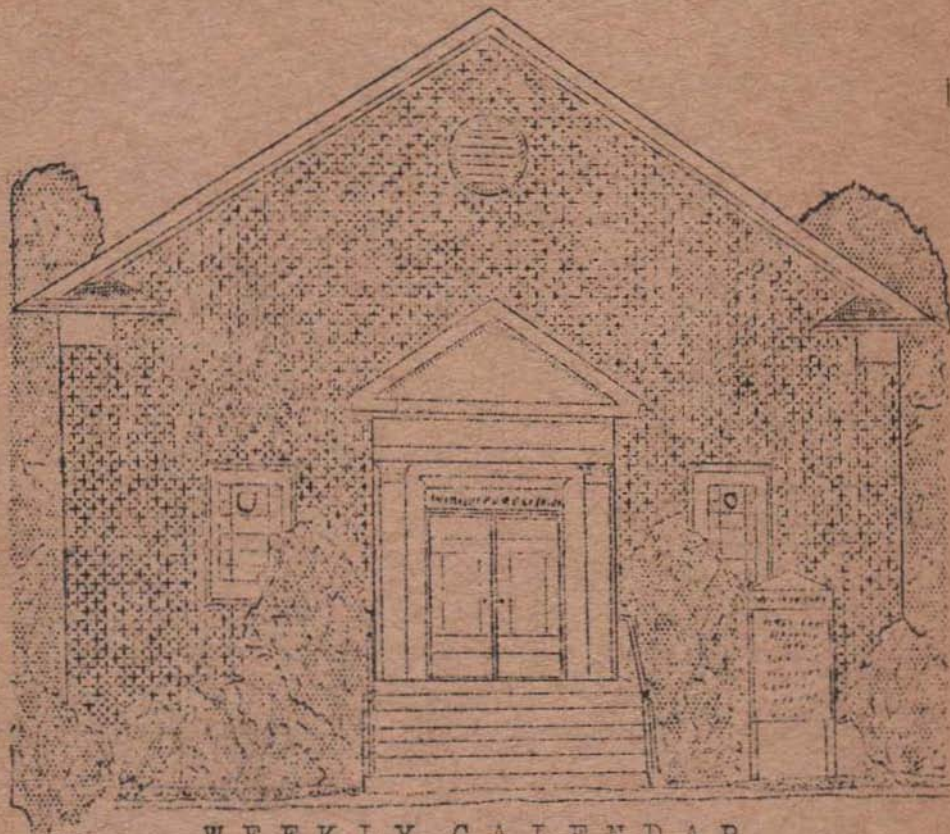

BUILDING FUND

On August 13, 1944 it was decided by the church committee to purchase a home for the Minister. It was also decided to start another building fund to take care of this expense.

It was agreed by this committee to purchase house and 5 acres of land from A. P. Warner, for the sum of \$1500.00. A loan was secured to take care of \$1400.00.
