GEISLER'S ATTACK ON BAPTISM

Dr. Norman Geisler is noted as a elite scholar within the denominational world. While there is no doubt about his credentials regarding the canonization, preservation, and transmission of the Bible, he has allowed himself to be blinded by the prejudice the denominational world generally has against the Biblical doctrine of baptism. In his book, *When Critics Ask*, Geisler twists what Paul said with regard to baptism in I Corinthians 1:17. Norman Geisler says, Paul's statement means "baptism is not a part of what saves us." In response to Dr. Geisler's statement Wayne Jackson wrote,

"The apostle was not disassociating himself from the importance of baptism as a component in the sacred plan of redemption (Mk. 16:16; Acts 2:38; 22:16; Gal. 3:27; I Pet. 3:21); rather, he was contending that no special adoration was to be attached to the person administering the rite.

Since Paul himself was immersed in order to have his sins "washed away" (Acts 22:16), and inasmuch as he taught that by means of baptism one enters "into Christ" (Rom. 6:3-4; Gal. 3:27), he certainly is not about to disavow the divine command as an element apart from the gospel.

It is an egregious fallacy to employ I Corinthians 1:17 in an attempt to nullify God's holy commandment."

Dr. Geisler attacked the Biblical teaching on baptism again in his book, *A Popular Survey of the News Testament*. On page five of that book he argues Mark 16:16 doesn't teach the necessity of baptism for salvation because "nowhere does it say, 'He who is not baptized will be condemned." The fallacy of Geisler's reasoning is clear. In Mark 16:16 Jesus said, "He

that believes and is baptized shall be saved." Does Jesus need to repeat the relationship of baptism to salvation for it to be true? Does Jesus have to restate the relationship of baptism to salvation in the negative for it to be true? Also, consider the fact that one who does not believe will not be baptized. Therefore, it is unnecessary to say "he that does not believe and is not baptized will be condemned." One only needs to say "he who does not believe will be condemned" for the statement to maintain its full impact and meaning. This is a very poor effort to get around a very clear statement from our Lord regarding the necessity of baptism in salvation.

Norman Geisler has his own personal website on which he teaches one simply needs to say a prayer in order to be saved. On the same website he dismisses the necessity of baptism for salvation by saying we are saved by faith alone. However Mr. Geisler also teaches through his website that we are saved by grace and saved by the gospel. If grace and the gospel are involved in our salvation then we are most certainly not saved by faith alone. Faith without the grace of God would be of no value, just as faith without obedience to God is of no value. Works of the Law of Moses cannot save us and are not involved in our salvation. There are no works we can perform and rightly say we have earned our salvation. But the reality is that those who do not obey God will not be saved (Matthew 7:21-22). Biblical faith is an obedient faith (James 2:14-26). And, works of obedience to God are involved in our salvation (Revelation 20:12-13). Also consider the fact that even while the Bible teaches us that faith saves, grace saves, and the Gospel saves (all of which Geisler admits), the Bible also teaches us that baptism saves (I Peter 3:21). Therefore, all are involved in our salvation. Grace, faith, the Gospel, and baptism are all necessary elements of salvation.

I have a lot of respect for the academic scholarship of Dr. Norman Geisler. He co-authorized a book entitled, *A General Introduction to the Bible*, which I have found to be an excellent resource though I do not agree with everything in it. I also respect the fact that he has worked hard to earn his advanced degrees and most certainly deserves them. There is no doubt he has done some good work in Christian apologetics also. But, the reality is that his scholarship, intellectual standing, and advanced degrees have not helped him to see the truth regarding salvation in general and baptism specifically. On page 141 of his book, *Correcting The*

Cults, Norman Geisler refers to Mark 16:16 and says, "Cults and aberrant groups cite this in support of their belief that baptism is necessary for salvation." Mirriam-Webster.com defines the word "aberrant" as to mean "straying from the right or normal way." Dr. Geisler would then classify the churches of Christ as those who are straying from the right and normal way, and he would also then classify the Lord's church as a cult. Geisler would do well to stick with what he knows about the canonization, transmission, and preservation of the Bible, and stay away from writing and lecturing on salvation. As smart as he is, he has been blinded by the typical prejudice of a denominational world caught in the grips of the philosophy espoused by John Calvin.
