"When Did You Graduate?"

Graduation in May and college in August. This is the time of year many young people leave home for the first time. Parents, there are some things you can do to strengthen the love between you and your college-bound kids. 1) Trust your children and continue to expect the best. When I was a campus minister many students told me the confidence their parents had in them, kept them from doing many wrong things. 2) Be faithful to God and to each other. A stable home is still important after children leave. 3) Communicate: write, call, visit, and send a "care package" with some of their favorite goodies in it. Let them know the good news and the bad news that takes place at home. Although some news is hurtful, it lets them know they aren't being left out. And don't count how many letters they send; college is demanding. But if you need to hear from them, let them know. Yes they're leaving, but they still need you and love you. Don't wait until next graduation to strengthen your relationship. By then, it may be too late.

Suppose they have gone to college once and it didn't work out — what then? You still need to strengthen the bonds of family love. Trust is still an area to work on, teach them why you want to expect the best and find ways to mutually build that trust. Be faithful to God and to each other still provides that stability children need to see in their parents. Communicate: learn how to make that a "two-way" communication. Life is demanding. Let them know what takes place in the family, especially if they live in another town.

No, I don't have anyone in mind; it's just that we never need give up on trying strengthening our children. After all, God doesn't quit trying to strengthen His. (Philippians 4:13)

ELDERS CORNER:

Four Rules of Friendliness

<u>The 30-second Rule:</u> Most guests will make a judgment about us during the first 30 seconds after they enter. Greet people at the doors with a handshake and a smile.

<u>The Front Door Rule:</u> Many people need help to find their classes. If they find it difficult to locate a class, they may choose not to return.

<u>The Ten-Foot Rule:</u> Greet any person with whom you are not familiar who comes within ten feet of you. Make eye contact and be friendly.

The Five Minute Rule: Take the first five minutes after the assembly to seek out guests and greet them. Thank them for coming and encourage them to return.

Beyond these, it is important for us to be sure that no visitors sit alone. If we just greet our visitors and then make a point of visiting with them after the assembly, yet we let them sit alone, we are not making the kind of first impression that we really want. Let's make a point of inviting our visitors to sit with us. If they are invited by several people, that is even better.

Try to be more friendly. Practice the above rules. You not only will be an encouragement to Warners Chapel, but more importantly, you will show the love that Jesus taught us and honor our Father in Heaven.
