DOES PRAYER WORK?

A member of the church here at Warners Chapel asks this question: "Since the miraculous age is over, and God doesn't do miracles anymore, why should we continue to pray for His help?"

The conundrum presented by the aforementioned question is that there is an assumption that miracles do not exist today. Medical experts have recorded the disappearance of Cancer in their patients that cannot be explained. An intervention occurs and a passenger who was to get on a plane missed the boarding and the plane crashes unexplainably.

We have concluded that God does not work miracles through men in a supernatural way anymore. Those in the first century were empowered to work miracles through the "laying on of the Apostles hands." (Acts 8:18) Spiritual gifts were given to further the Gospel by miraculous signs and to reveal truth. Not everyone received a spiritual/miraculous gift and not everyone was healed or raised from the dead.

If the impartation of miraculous gifts was accomplished solely by the Apostles, then when all the Apostles had died, the impartation of the gifts died with them. The inspired writer of First Corinthians, Paul, foretold of the end of the miraculous age in 1 Corinthians 13:8-12.

God, Himself, isn't limited by an ending of men doing miracles as He gave His apostles the ability to do miracles in the first century.

God may decide to answer a prayer only through what can be considered a miracle (meaning the odds simply are too large for the human mind to grasp the happening as anything but a miracle).

Maybe the best miracle that can still be seen today is the miracle of remission of sins. "through faith in the operation of God…" (Colossians 2:12) one's sins can be remitted and a new creature is born (2 Corinthians 5:17). The proof of this can be seen in the Christian's daily walk.

James 5:16 informs us that prayer can move God to perform a miracle: "Confess *your* faults one to another, and pray one for another, that ye may be healed. The effectual fervent prayer of a righteous man availeth much."

EVERY MAN'S BOOK

The Bible is every man's book. To know the Bible and to handle it aright is the greatest accomplishment within the reach of any person. One may know English, astronomy, literature, music, sociology, and philosophy; but if one does not know the Bible, one has failed in the only subject that brings all things into their proper relationship and that enables one to know life at its best.

It is not intended for some special group. But not only is the Bible every man's book, it is written for the average person. Scholars may study it, but it is not written necessarily with scholars in mind. No one ever outgrows the Scriptures. The more one studies them, the wider and deeper they become. No one will ever be a useful Christian unless one is a student of the Bible. Matthew Henry said, "The Scriptures were not written to make us astronomers, but to make us saints." It is no wonder that Paul urged Timothy to study the Scriptures, "rightly dividing" (handling aright) the word of truth, that he might be an approved workman before God (2 Timothy 2:15).

The Bible acknowledges man's faults; it is patient with man's weaknesses; and it is honest with his virtues and his hopes.

To own the Bible is to be rich. To study, to know, and to trust the Bible is to find life. To study the Bible is to be wise, to obey it, to be strong.
