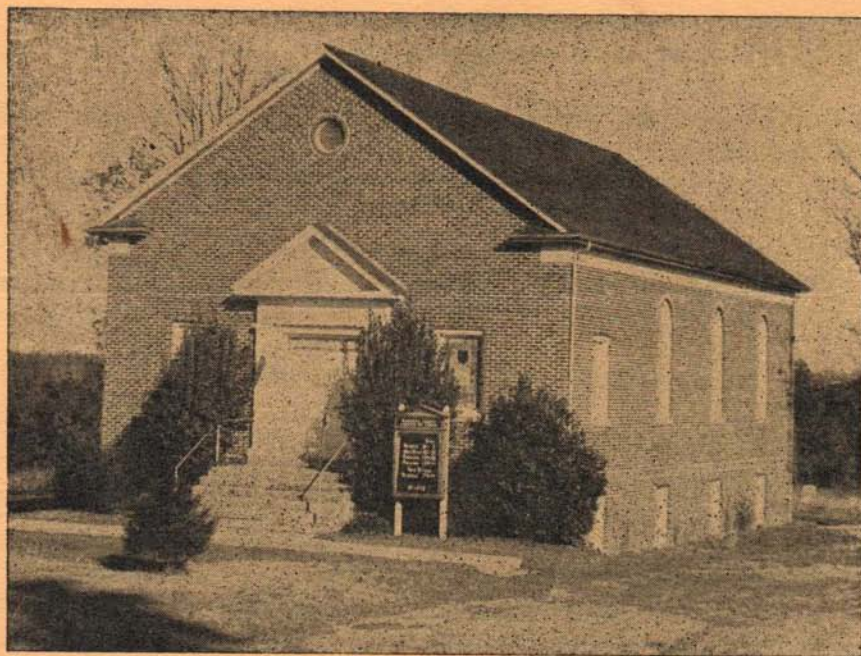

Sav-ior	mispronounced	Sav-yur
Glory	"	Glo-ree
Ho-ly	"	Ho-lee
Hea-ven	"	Hea-vun
Vine-yard	"	Vine-yurd

Almost each word in a song should be studied carefully, to see if we are giving it the correct enunciation.

The word again should be pronounced a-gen'. and in the last verse of "What a Friend", the word solace is mispronounced by almost everyone. The word is sol-ace, not so-lace. Look it up if you like.
