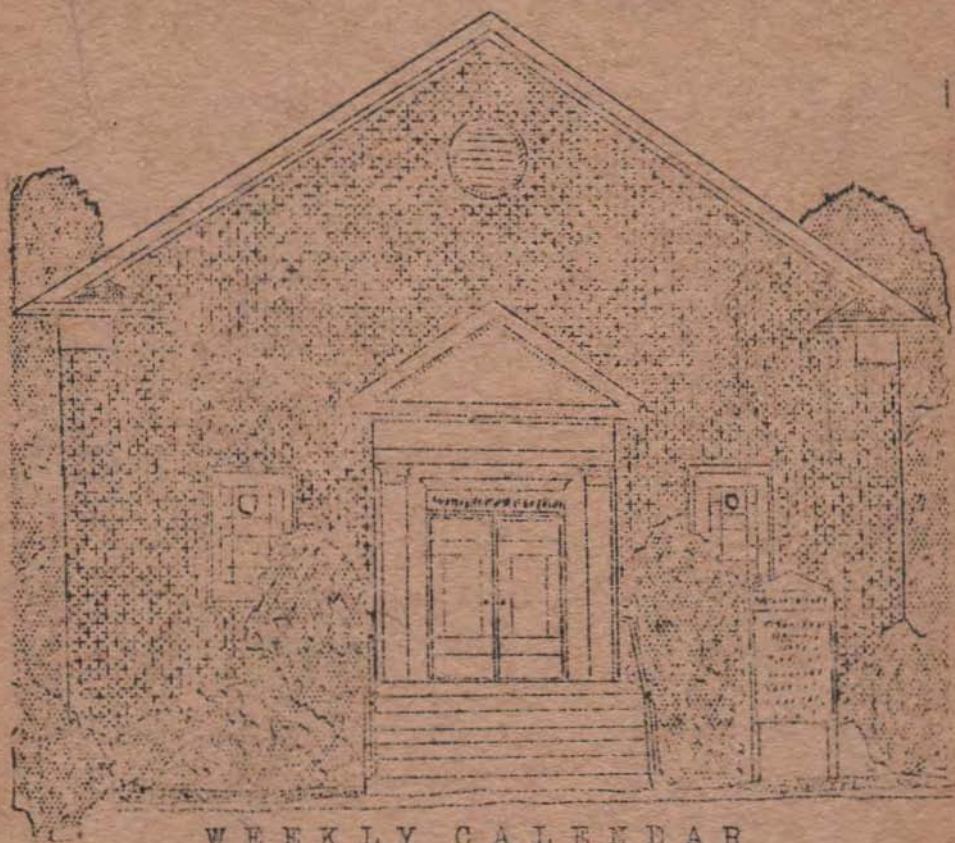

DID YOU KNOW?

January 11, 1920, John W. Warner was appointed as Treasurer of Warner's Chapel church of Christ to succeed J. P. Binkley who resigned due to declining health. Bro. Warner has served patiently and faithfully in this capacity until the present time.

The membership at Warner's Chapel in 1917 was 90. The present membership is 151.

In a business meeting March 13, 1935, Bro. W. P. Messick was authorized to draw plans for the present building, and estimate the cost of construction. Actual construction began in July, 1936.
