Attendance for the quarter averaged 9+. The regular collection was \$18.43.

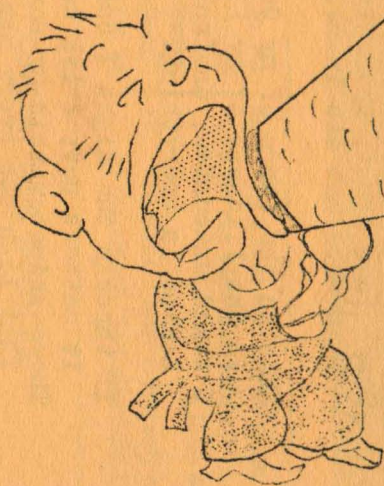
We enjoyed having 13 visitors.
