WHAT MUST ALIENS DO TO BE SAVED?

Aliens must believe the gospel of God revealed through his blessed Son. The Scripture says: "But without faith it is impossible to please him: for he that cometh to God must believe that he is, and that he is a rewarder of them that diligently seek him." (Heb. 11:6)

In the exercise of their faith--- aliens are people who will repent of all their sins; for it was Jesus who said: "Except ye repent, ye shall all likewise perish." (Luke 13:3.)

Aliens must do as did the eunuch, following their repentance. He confessed, saying: "I believe that Jesus Christ is the Son of God." With his lips he expressed the belief that was in his heart. "With the mouth confession is made unto salvation."

Aliens who have gone this far will find they are yet short of salvation from alien sins. All of this must be followed with a burial in baptism. Believing, repenting, confessing aliens are willing to: "Arise, and be baptized, and wash away thy sins." (Acts 22:16.) They willingly are: "Buried with him in baptism, wherein also ye are risen with him through the faith of the operation of God who hath raised him from the dead." (Col. 2:12.) Thus their faith and obedience have led them from condemnation to salvation for Jesus said: "He that believeth and is baptized shall be saved." (Mark 16:16) When this has been done, the following Scripture now applies: "Now therefore ye are no more strangers and foreigners (aliens) but fellowcitizens with the saints, and of the household of God." (Eph. 2:19.) Before this obedience they were "without God, without Christ, strangers, and without hope," but they are now: 1. In God. (Acts 17:28.) 2. In Christ. (Phil. 3:9.) 3. Friends. (John 15:14.) 4. And have hope. (Eph. 4:4.)

WHAT MUST CHRISTIANS DO TO KEEP SAVED?

Christians to keep saved, must not do certain things as well as do certain things. Christians,

MUST NOT--

1. Christians must not "observe days, and months, and times, and years." (Gal. 4: 9-11.) Where this is done the gospel labor has been in vain. Special days of the

Jews, Lent, Easter, Christmas and other days borrowed from Rome come under the condemnation of the Scriptures

2. Christians to keep saved, must not call priests "father" (Matt. 23:9); preachers, "reverend" (Psm. 111:9); Jews, "rabbi" (Matt. 23: 8); or a man, "potentate" (Grand Worshipful Master.) (1 Tim. 6: 15.)

3. Christians must not "love the world, neither the things that are in the world." ( 1 John 2: 15-17.)

MUST---

1. Worship regularly. (Heb. 10: 25.) They must "continue stedfastly" and regularly worship God in "spirit and in truth."

2. Christians must live "soberly, righteously, and godly, in this present world." (Tit 2: 11,12.) Christians shun the life of a "murderer, a thief, an evildoer, and a busybody in other men's matters." Neither should men nor women be guilty of "idleness, running about from house to house, and gossiping."

3. Christians must watch the company they keep. "Evil company" still "corrupts good manners", and contributes to delinquency.

4. Christians must remember to "abstain from all appearance of evil." ( 1 Thess. 5:22.) "They must keep themselves pure," and they must "keep themselves from idols" The love of money can easily become an idol, and "the love of money is the root of all kinds of evil." Does

a. Christian profit if "he shall gain the whole world, and lose his own soul"?

5. Children of God must "present their bodies a living sacrifice," (Rom. 12;1.) We should make every effort possible to further the Lord's cause, during fair weather or foul, during prosperity and during adversity.

6. Christians "must run with patience the race that is set before them." (Heb. 12: 1, 2.) The race must be finished, and there is no profit in viewing it from the sidelines nor is there profit in falling out of the race while others run. As we run we must "look unto Jesus," the source of our strength and endurance.

7. Every Christian must "watch and pray." Our adversary the devil "walketh about seeking whom he may devour."
