SUGGESTIONS FOR PREACHERS

Directing a school of preaching is a very rewarding endeavor. Over the years I have compiled a great deal of material on the subject. Here are ten simple suggestions for preachers.

- 1. Remember that you are not yet a Bible scholar even though you are graduating from school. You have years of intensive study ahead of you on many themes until you reach a level of maturity. Be a student all of your life. Never think of your studies as finished.
- 2. Build a large and useful library. Invest a regular part of your income into a solid reference library and make use of it continually.
- 3. Remember that your study of Greek in school has not made you a Greek Scholar. Nothing is more dangerous than an introduction to Greek who does not realize his limitations. Always remember that in Greek grammar there are scores of "exceptions to the rules."
- 4. Remember that congregations are never perfect. They are made up of fallible humans just as we are. Do not expect perfection or be too disappointed when imperfections are seen.
- 5. You will probably begin your work with those congregations that need help the most. These small struggling churches have more than a fair share of problems. Most young preachers usually experience at least one "bad match" early in their career.
- 6. Do not be a status seeker ... i.e., a "church climber," always looking for a bigger, more notable work. Be willing to serve God even in a small, simple church if that is where you can be more productive for Him.
- 7. When you find a good stable congregation and you are compatible with each other, stay with them and build together a great work for God.
- 8. Be a servant and teacher for the entire membership of the congregation where you work. Never let a clique, large or small dominate your time and interest.
- 9. Always form your own opinions about the members of your new work. Do not let some "helpful" brother or sister "fill you in" on the worth of the brethren.
- 10. You will never regret what you do not say!

ELDERS CORNER:

Nicaragua Mission – Part 2

When we arrived in El Rama we went immediately to the gymnasium to begin setup of the clinic. Unfortunately the gym that had been reserved had suddenly become unavailable due to a wedding. We had a letter from the mayor stating we could use it but communication with the mayor wasn't possible because he was drunk. Thankfully, within 15 minutes another location was offered to us which turned out to be a great spot. You simply never know what might happen in Nicaragua.

There were many heart breaking cases witnessed at the clinic during the week from the handicapped children who obviously do not get the care and attention they need, to people literally mobbing the entrance in an attempt to simply get some medical care. During one of my bible studies I met a bed-ridden 19 year old young man named Isaiah. They simply wanted me to pray for him. I found out that he had leg surgery and they found extensive cancer. In the States it most certainly could have been caught sooner, treated and probably cured. But in El Rama, this young man will not survive. But the most heart wrenching story of all is the story of Juanita. Juanita's plight came to the attention of Jeannie Moore as Juanita made her way through the medical clinic. Juanita's home consisted of two rooms with only half height walls, some black plastic and a tin roof. Her "kitchen" (basically a stone stove for cooking over wood) was in the middle of muddy mire. Every time it rained her kitchen was flooded and the water passed through the outhouse on its way to the kitchen. The children when first seen were naked. They had no clothes to speak of at all. Conditions were worse than a pig

Jeannie brought the situation to Mark Roy and after seeing how this poor family was living, he made it his mission to help Juanita and her family. He collected money and then went around town to various places with Domingo to buy the supplies needed to build Juanita a porch area off the ground where she could move her kitchen. He and several others along with a few hired locals rerouted the ditch around her house in an attempt to get the rainwater redirected. They built a 12x12 deck off the ground and installed a tin roof such that any water coming off the old roof would shed properly away from her house. We'll show some pictures in our upcoming presentation.

The clinic put together a bundle of clothes and shoes and bedrolls were purchased so the kids would not have to sleep on the floor. She didn't even have any chairs so we bought her 5 chairs. Juanita visited the nightly gospel meeting and you cannot imagine how her face beamed at the help a few Americans provided for her. Her life was truly changed through the efforts of some caring Christians. Some of the extra benevolence funds that we took helped pay for this so you also played a part in changing their lives. Truth is...our lives were forever changed as well.

James 2:15-17 - ¹⁵ If a brother or sister is naked and destitute of daily food, ¹⁶ and one of you says to them, "Depart in peace, be warmed and filled," but you do not give them the things which are needed for the body, what *does it* profit? ¹⁷ Thus also faith by itself, if it does not have works, is dead.
