THE CITY WITH FOUNDATIONS

Cities come and go, nations rise and fall, and God is control of it all (Daniel 4). One can be a faithful Christian in Europe, Asia, Africa, Australia, South America, or North America. Christians can move from place to place and be Christians in each place they live. Members of the church can appreciate whatever good they may see in the country in which they live and thank God for whatever blessings they may enjoy. In addition we recognize there are certain obligations we have toward the authorities under which we live (Romans 13:1-8). And yet, we must never forget that earth is not our home. We are not staying here. We are pilgrims passing through. While we respect the laws of the nation in which we are citizens we know that ultimately we are citizens of heaven (Philippians 3:20). If we will keep this perspective in mind it will dramatically change the level of peace within our hearts and strengthen our faith.

Hebrews chapter eleven records brief descriptions of the faith of men and women "of whom the world was a not worthy (Hebrews 11:38)." These great people served God with a strong obedient faith. Men like Noah, Abraham, and Moses are mentioned. Each of them great men of faith who acted in humble obedience to God. Women like Sarah, Jochebed, and Rahab are held up as examples in this chapter also. Each of these people showed tremendous courage, trust, and confidence in Almighty God, and each of them displayed exemplary confidence in receiving an eternal home in heaven with God.

Hebrews 11:10 says Abraham, "waited for the city which has foundations, whose builder and maker is God." That is a reference to heaven. The context speaks to us of Abraham's willingness to go wherever on earth God told him to go. It didn't matter to Abraham where he lived.

He could serve God in any part of the world. It didn't matter to Abraham were he lived. Earth was not his home, and he was simply passing through on his way to heaven.

Hebrews 11:13 says these people all "confessed that they were strangers and pilgrims on earth." It is very popular today to speak of heaven on earth. Many people teach that the reward for Christians will be a renewed earth. But this verse corrects that idea. Faithful followers of God are strangers and pilgrims on earth. Strangers are those who don't belong, and pilgrims are those who are not staying. We don't belong here beyond the time of our lives. We won't be staying here either. We have a heavenly home waiting for us. Having the perspective of being a stranger and a pilgrim on this earth will go a long way toward helping us to be happier Christians.

The Bible also says these great men and women of faith were seeking a homeland (Hebrews 11:14) which is the "better," and "heavenly country (Hebrews 11:16)." They were seeking the city built and prepared for them by God (Hebrews 11:16). They truly understood this world is not our home. We have something so much better waiting for us. In heaven there will be no more death, nor sorrow, nor crying, nor pain (Revelation 21:4). Heaven is that beautiful and peaceful place where we will enjoy eternal life in the fellowship God (Revelation 20:1-5).

Peter said God's abundant mercy has given us a living hope of an inheritance in heaven that cannot be corrupted (1 Peter 1:3-4). Heaven is our hope. Heaven is our home. To God be the praise and honor for He has graciously provided a glorious home in heaven for those who serve Him.

Roll The Gospel Chariot Along

Many of you know the song children sing during VBS entitled, "Roll the Gospel Chariot." This was one of my favorite songs as a young boy, especially when we got to the line that said, "When the Devil's, in the way, we will run right over him" When we sang that line, we would roll our arms as fast as we could, imitating the turning of a wheel, and we would "run over the Devil" at high speed!

But what I could never understand as a child is why we would sing the line, "When the sinner's in the way, we will stop and pick him up." From my understanding at the time, I didn't want to "stop and pick them up;" I wanted to "run right over them too!" I mean, why not? If we were going to run over the Devil in our "Gospel Chariot," why wouldn't we also run over a sinner who was behaving like the Devil?

As an adult, I understand what I didn't understand as a child. We must learn to make distinction between the sin and the sinner. While we are to hate sin (Romans 12:9), we are to love the sinner (Romans 5:8; Luke 19:10). However, if truth be told, although we may understand the meaning of this song, we may in practice be guilty of "running right over the sinner" instead of "stopping and picking him up."

Maybe we need to do a little introspection. Does your "Gospel Chariot" slow down for sinners, or mow them down? Give it some thought.
