WHAT DID JESUS LOOK LIKE?

We don't really know the answer to that question but many Americans and Europeans think the Jesus was White. I remember in the movie, <u>Malcolm X</u>, the lead character, while in prison, challenged a protestant preacher concerning a portrait of Jesus that he had brought with him to their religion class. "Blond-haired, blue-eyed Jesus?"

In all probability, Jesus was much darker in his complexion. People born in the region that Jesus lived were olive skinned and had black or dark brown hair. As a carpenter' son, he would have spent some time in the sun and so therefore was darker still.

Regardless of his skin color, Jesus did not have regard to others' skin color or nationality. Though Jesus was a Jew, he spoke freely to a Samaritan woman.

"The woman saith unto him, Sir, I perceive that thou art a prophet. Our fathers worshipped in this mountain; and ye say, that in Jerusalem is the place where men ought to worship. Jesus saith unto her, Woman, believe me, the hour cometh, when ye shall neither in this mountain, nor yet at Jerusalem, worship the Father. Ye worship ye know not what: we know what we worship: for salvation is of the Jews. But the hour cometh, and now is, when the true worshippers shall worship the Father in spirit and in truth: for the Father seeketh such to worship him. (John 4:19-23)

Custom prohibited a Jew from entering into the house of a Gentile and yet when persuaded by a Roman Centurion to visit his servant who was sick, Jesus replied, "Go thy way; and as thou hast believed, *so* be it done unto thee. And his servant was healed in the selfsame hour." (Matthew 8:13)

The servants and followers of Jesus must be like Him. We should be accepting and loving and living in harmony with all people, gender, race and ethnicity.

The Elders Corner:

Nicaragua 2014

This is the 16th year that Warners Chapel has been involved in mission trips to Nicaragua or Panama. In just 9 short weeks, another group from Warners Chapel will be flying out of Greensboro to Miami to Managua and then onto Diriamba, Nicaragua for the 2014 medical/evangelism mission.

We have 9 members participating this year including David and Jeannie Moore, Andy and Mindy Santiago, Ingrid Mock, Karen Clemmons, Tara Roy, Todd Hinson and nervous first-timer Dana Hinson. They will be joining approximately 70 other Christians from various congregations for a week of outreach to the residents of Diriamba.

As the congregation is well aware, mission work is not inexpensive and each team member has already committed a deposit of \$300 or \$2,700. Total expenses will be approximately \$14,000 for the entire group or about \$1,550 per person. The elders have committed \$7,000 this year to this work leaving a balance of around \$4,300. If you can assist in offsetting these expenses in addition to your regular contribution, there are envelopes on the desk in the foyer marked Nicaragua. Make your checks out to Warners Chapel to ensure your contribution is tax deductible.

Your contributions will help preach the gospel to the people of Diriamba and help provide much needed medical and benevolence assistance to the residents of the 2nd poorest country in the Western hemisphere. The ladies are also making dresses that will be taken and those are always appreciated and loved.

Even if you cannot give, please pray for the safety and health of the team and that God's word will find pure hearts willing to accept the gospel.
