HANDCLAPPING

At sporting events the crowds applaud the achievements of their favorite athletes and teams. In so doing, they are recognizing the accomplishments of those players, and encouraging them to play hard. Do we need applause in the worship service? Should we be applauding God for his achievements? No! We should praise God for what He has done by doing so in the manner in which he has specified (1 Corinthians 14:40), and in the specific methods He has authorized (John 4:24). Should we be applauding the achievements of the preacher, song leader, or prayer leader? No! We are not there to focus on man and to praise man. We assemble to worship God (Jon 4:24).

At an entertainment event people applaud the skill of the entertainers. Is worship an entertainment event? Entertainment events are designed with a focus to an audience. Worship is not to be focused upon man. Worship is to be focused upon God (John 4:24). To degrade the worship of our God to the level of cheap entertainment is irreverent (Hebrews 12:28).

Isn't hand clapping a joyful noise? And if it is a joyful noise, can it not be used in worship to God? The expression "joyful noise" is found in the poetic context of Psalm 100. This poetic context refers to Old Testament worship and not New Testament worship. The Old Law has been nailed to the cross (Colossians 2:14-17). We are now living under the New Law (Hebrews 9:15-17). We must find our authorization for worship practices in the New Testament and not in the Old. Besides that, suggesting we can applaud in worship because it is a joyful noise is a foolish and faulty argument that can lead to all kinds of things. Some think blowing on whistles is a joyful noise. Others may want to bring in the New Year's Eve noise-makers into worship. After all, that is a joyful noise to some. Then again, some consider the sound of a Harley Davidson motorcycle to be a joyful noise. Why not rev one up next time you worship?

Well - surely handclapping is just another way to say amen. Right? Wrong! Saying amen is a practice for which we have specific authority (1 Corinthians 14:16). Handclapping is an entirely different practice for which there is no authority. Saying amen is making a verbal statement of agreement. Clapping your hands together is not saying anything verbally. It is not the same practice. One is authorized and the other is not. Nowhere in the New Testament will you find the Christians applauding in worship. Nowhere will you find handclapping implied in Christian worship. Nowhere will you find handclapping commanded for worship. Therefore, we have no authority to engage in the practice. Let us keep handclapping, and all other foolish man-made denominational practices out of true and simple New Testament worship.



FALLING FROM GRACE

We are often told that a Christian can't fall,

That once he is saved there's no danger at all:
