OUR GOSPEL MEETING

Does our gospel meeting mean an opportunity to examine and evaluate our lives? Honest self-reflection is a must for Christians (II Cor. 13:5). Gospel meetings provide an important occasion for all of us to look at ourselves in the light of God's word (Jas. 1:21-27).

We all may be sure that the speaker for our gospel meeting, Jeff Trotter, will build up, challenge, stimulate, and even rebuke us as needed from God's word. Few of us would turn down a good dinner invitation. Isn't that exactly what a gospel meeting is?

Article VI

The Attitude of Giving

Paul wrote in 1 Corinthians 13:3, "And though I bestow all my goods to feed *the poor*, and though I give my body to be burned, but have not love, it profits me nothing" (NKJV). Giving with the right attitude is very important. Scripture clearly teaches that a gift with the wrong attitude, without love, is worthless and is of no profit to the giver. Our Lord set the standard in John 3:16, "For God so *loved* the world that He *gave* His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have everlasting life" (NKJV).

Why should we give? Giving with a right attitude sets our hearts and minds to Christ. Matthew 6:21 tells us, "For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also" (NKJV). Giving also helps us develop an unselfish Christ-like character. Most importantly, proper giving enables us to invest for eternity. Matthew 6:20 reads, "But lay up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust destroys and where thieves do not break in and steal" (NKJV). We have to guard against allowing the "things" of this world to cause a barrier to be placed between us and God. Proper giving will break this barrier down.
