ELDERS CORNER

Cusco, Peru Mission

In the history of Warners Chapel, we have never had “one of our own” dedicated to a foreign mission work until September, 2014. At that time, Sarah Tesh Davis and her husband Ryan committed themselves to a five year mission in Cusco, Peru. Since their arrival there have been over 41 baptisms. Sarah and Ryan work tirelessly day in and day out teaching various Bible classes and preparing the men (and women) to have a self-sufficient congregation in the future. They also work extremely hard in building relationships that eventually turn into Bible studies.

The Cusco mission will be very different from the medical campaigns in Nicaragua for various reasons. One is far less campaigners overall. This year 6 participants will be joining up with 24 other campaigners from Alabama and Tennessee in Cusco for their annual evangelism campaign. Rather than medical being the attraction, there will be two separate evangelism outreach projects each day. One will be directed to women from a local battered women’s shelter who were raped and have small children. The second will be in San Jeronimo which is on the outskirts of Cusco. There, participants will be visiting homes for children that live in extreme poverty. In both of these areas, Bible studies for the adults and VBS type sessions for the kids will be held.

Some participants will be staying in a local hotel (\$15-20/night) and others will be housed with the local missionaries. The hotel or missionary families will provide breakfast, lunch is prepared by some of the local members and campaigners, and dinner is on your own with the group at different local restaurants each night specializing in Peruvian cuisine.

While the participant costs are similar, there are some other significant differences beyond the size of the campaign. First, instead of a 5 hour trip to Central America, the trip to South America will take about 16 hours. Participants will be leaving Greensboro at 2pm on July 22nd and will fly Delta to Atlanta and then onto Lima, Peru. From Lima they will fly LAN Airlines to Cusco and will arrive just after 5am (Cusco time) on the 23rd. The other significant difference is the altitude. Cusco is considered a “two mile high” city so campaigners may feel the effects of the thinner air and some in the past have experienced altitude sickness which includes headaches and nausea. Temperatures will be in the 70’s during the day and in the 30’s at night with no heating and no air conditioning.

Like Nicaragua, all of the Warners participants have contributed their \$500 commitment fee, the treasury contributed \$500 per participant and the balance was funded this year from the Jim and Gladys Harper memorial. We plan to take extra funds to help with various benevolent and special needs that may arise. There are envelopes on the desk in the foyer marked Peru if you would like to give over and above your regular contribution.

Please pray for the campaign and the safety and well-being of all participants.
