TRUE WORSHIP

"GOSPEL PREACHING"

The making known of God's Will to the people has always depended to a very large degree upon its public proclamation by faithful men.

In Old Testament times God spake unto the fathers by the prophets. In these last days God hath spoken through His Son, Jesus Christ.

Jesus spent three and one-half years preparing his apostles to preach the Gospel. So important was the message entrusted to these men that they were forbidden to preach these glad tidings until they were endued with the Holy Spirit. This Spirit was to guide these men into all truth and bring all things that Jesus taught them to their memory.

When the disciples at Troas gathered together to break bread Paul being present he preached the Gospel to them. Thus we see the preaching of the Gospel as a part of the worship in the early church. Peter said, "If any man speak, let him speak as the oracles of God; (1 Peter 4:11). Paul told Timothy to "Preach the word; be instant in season and out of season; reprove, rebuke, exhort with all longsuffering and doctrine." (2 Tim. 4:2). Again Paul said, "And the things that thou has heard of me among many witnesses, the same commit thou to faithful men, who shall be able to teach others also." (2 Tim. 2:2).
