The New Name.

And the Gentiles shall see thy righteousness, and all t he kings thy glory: and thou shalt be called by a"NEW N ME", which the mouth of the Lord shall name. Isaiah. 62:2 The NEW NAME was to be given, after the kings had behel a the glory of Christ. The glory of Christ was made man ifest during his personal ministery. His acknowledgemen t as Son, by the Father. Matt. 考:17; He is exhalted above b oth Moses and Elijah. Matt. 17:5; John. 17 Chapter. But the Gentiles must see his righteousness before the NEW NAME is given. We read from Acts, 10 chapter, of the convers ion of the Gentiles. Namely, Corneilus, and his household Then, in the very next chapter, verse 26 we find the new name given, and being worn. Those who contend, that there as nothing in a name, would not name their children, Fid o, or Satan. Why? Because these names are generally appli ed to dogs, not human beings. Sometimes horses are named Mebel, or Lucifer. But not so with our children. Why not? These names are not for human beings.Just try calling an American, Joe Stalin, or Hitler, Mussolini or Hirohito And, we soon leran that there is something in a name. Ye s, there is much in a name. Adam was authorized to name e very creeping thing, that was upon the face of the earth God brought them to Adam to see what he would call the m: and whatsoever Adam called every living creature, that was the name thereof. Conssis 2:19. Perhaps it will be p

lainer if we shall put down some thoughts in the form of promises and then draw the conclusions: Syllogism. On e. The Bible condemns human names(1st Cor.1:12,13) The n ame"Lutheran"is a human name. Therefore, the name Luther an is under condemnation. Religious work is to be done in the NAME OF THE LORD. (Col. 3:17) Presbyterians do rel igious work in the name of Presbyterian. Therefore, the Presbyterians are guilty of error. Man is commanded to glorify God in the name "CHRISTIAN" (1st Peter 4:16) Cath olics are trying to glorify God in the name Catholic.T herefore, Catholics are in disobedience to the command of God. The names in the minor premises are used as exa mples. Many other names could have been used and the co nclusions would have been the same. If the major and mi nor premises are true-and they are true-the conclusi ons are true. We Blead with the good people of the worl d to repudiate all human, divisive and unscriptural name s. And the plea is meeting with success; thousands are giving up the unscriptural for the scriptural. Note thi s: The word "REVEREND" is found only one time in the Engl ish translation of the Bible. (And it does not refer to man, but God. Psalms 3: 9) Nowhere do we read of Reverend Paul, or the Right Reverend Peter, or James. These were men who were weak creatures of the earth, realizing the ir utter dependence on God. They refused to be honored. (Acts 10:25,26; Acts 14:8,18) They gloried only in the cross of Christ. (Gal. 6:14) You hear preachers speak of Paul as plain Paul, James as just plain James, Hohn as pl ain John, Jesus as just Plain Jesus, but speak of themse lves and other preachers as "REVEREND SO AND SO". This wo uld be comical, if it were not so tragic. Even Jesus whi le here upon the earth, in the flesh, refused the title of "GOOD" (Matt. 19:16, 17) Paul began some of his epistle s in these words: (Romans 1:1; Phil.1:1) This man of God described himself as, a servant, or bondservant. But many uninspired preachers of today affix the nost sacred an d highest terms possible to their names. What a contrast! The desire for high-sounding titles grows cut of a des ire to be exalted. We are reminded just here, of the per tinent words of Jesus: Whosoever would become great amo ng you shall be your minister; and whoseever would be f rst among you shall be your servant. (Matt 20:26,27).

Yes, there is much in the name Christian. This name is to be worn by "ALL" of God's people. Never should any person desire to wear that which God has not authorize d. In this name we glorify the Son of God. (1Peter 4:16 Neither is there salvation in any other. (Acts 4:12) Had we have needed more than this name to glorify God in, He would have given it to us. Let us be C-H-R-I-S-T-I-A-N-S only.

What, Then, Is A Christian?

In the scriptures, we find this new name for the first time in (Acts 11:26) "And when he had found him, he brought him to Antioch. And it came to pass, that a whole year they assembled themselves with the church, and taught much people. And the disciples were called Christians first in Antioch." One is a Christian, IF: 1. In faith (Heb.11:6--"But without faith it is impossible to please him: for he that cometh to God must believe that he is and that he as a rewarder of them that di ligently seek him"), he is a believer in Christ. (John 8:24--"I said therefore unto you, that ye shall die in your sins: for if ye believe not that I am HE, ye shall die in your sins: ")

2. In Character he is humble.(1Pet.5:6) "Humble yours elves therefore under the mighty hand of God, that he might exalt you in due time. (Phil 2:8) "And being found in fashion as a man, he humbled himself, and became obsdient unto death, even the death of the cross."

3. In knowledge, (John 8:32--"And ye shall know the truth, and thetruth shall make you free."), he is a disciple. (John 8:31)

4. In conflict, he is a peacemaker. (Matt 5:9) "Blesse J are the peacemakers: for they shall be called the children of God."

5. In obedience (Acts 5:29--"Then Peter and the other apostles answered and said, We ought to obey god rathe rthan men,") he is a friend of God. (John 15:14) "Ye are my friends, if ye do whatsoever I command you"

6. In name he is not ashamed (1 Peter 4:16) "Yet if a ny man suffer as a Christian, let him not be ashamed; But let him glorify God on this behalf," simply being a Christian.
