THE ELDERS CORNER:

Nicaragua 2015 - Part One

On Friday, June 12th at 4:15 a.m., 14 members of Warner Chapel and 1 from Abilene in Statesville met in the parking lot to head to Greensboro for our first flight to Miami. Twenty-six checked bags and two flights later we safely arrived in Managua and were settled into our rooms by noon Nicaragua time.

Saturday was a busy day of relocating from Managua to Granada to move into our rooms at the Alhambra Hotel for the week and then onto Nandaime to setup the clinic. All 100+ participants worked to unload supplies, setup stations, bag rice and beans, count and package pills, unpack duffels of clothing, and much more to prepare for the clinic to open on Sunday.

Sunday began our typical routine for the week. Up at 5a.m., breakfast at 6a.m., devotional at 6:30a.m., followed by announcements, on the bus by 7a.m., clinic until 5p.m., worship service at 5:30p.m., back on the bus by 7p.m., dinner by 8p.m., shower and lights out by 10p.m.. The days are long, hot, extremely busy, and very tiring. While the temperatures were in low 90's, the humidity was nearly the same, making the heat index one day 121 degrees. I decided not to look at the weather forecast any more after that.

The evangelism team had a total of 8 Americans, 7 translators, 9 local preachers, and several members participating. I carried a Fitbit and averaged walking 7 miles per day. This team was able to conduct 131 Bible studies in 4 days with 20 baptisms. It was encouraging to me to learn that out of the 20 baptisms that happened last year in Diriamba, 19 of those 20 are still faithful to the church.

Everyone had an assignment to perform each day. Some were moved around as differing needs arose. The Warners group kept team members and locals hydrated with water, kept the one toilet flushing, gave out over 700 custom made dresses (Warners supplied 200 of those), distributed clothing and rice and beans, fulfilled prescriptions in the pharmacy, took weights and blood pressures, taught hygiene classes, kept the crowd under control and in line, and so much more.

THANK YOU for your prayers, your contributions, 10 duffel bags of clothing and toys, and for your encouragement!!
