TRUE WORSHIP

"GIVING"

Then he is convinced of the reasons for partaking of the Lord's Supper every first day of the week he will accept that. Surely if we could only understand all the reasons for our giving we would be willing to accept this also.

We should give for our own personal good. No one loves to always receive and never be able to give. No one can develop into a worthwhile person without developing the true spirit of giving. It makes a person happy to be able to give. It is more blessed to give than to receive.

It is brotherly to give. There is always those who are less fortunate and stand in need of help. We are our brother's keeper. The church is to minister to the needy. This can be done only when we as members of the church give. "But whose hath this world's good, and seeth his brother have need, and shutteth up his bowels of compassion from him how dwelleth the love of God in him?" I John 3:17.
