ELDERS CORNER:

QUESTIONS CONCERNING REPENTANCE

The statement "If I've done anything wrong, I repent" [which is sometimes made by brethren] brings several questions to mind: (1) How can you repent of sin if you're not convinced you've committed sin? (2) How can you be forgiven of sin that was committed in ignorance? These are legitimate questions deserving of a Biblical answer.

We have an example of repentance in Matt. 21:28-29 which states: "A certain man had two sons; and he came to the first, and said, Son, go work today in my vineyard. He answered and said, I will not: but afterward he repented, and went." From these verses we understand that repentance is a change of mind that brings about a change of life. Repentance is not being sorry for sin because "godly sorrow produces repentance *leading* to salvation" [2 Corinthians 7:10]. The need for repentance of known sins is stressed in Luke 13:3 which indicates: "unless you repent you will all likewise perish." Furthermore, 1 John 1:9 teaches that "If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness." If a Christian is aware of sin in his [her] life and then makes the statement: "If I've done anything wrong, I repent", he [she] hasn't confessed any sin by the statement (1 John 1:9), and hasn't experienced a change of mind that brings about a life change (Matt. 21:28-29).

Bearing fruits worthy of repentance is evidence that true repentance has taken place. But how can you "bear fruits worthy of repentance" (Mat. 3:8) if you do not believe that you've sinned and have need of repentance? The logical answer to this question is you can't. Why then would Christians make the statement: "If I've done anything wrong,

I repent"? Not being able to read the mind of others, we can only suggest three possible explanations. First of all, it is possible that they do not have knowledge of the truth pertaining to repentance. Secondly, they may not believe they have sinned, but feel the need to make a quasi-confession in an attempt to get the proverbial monkey (their informer) off their back in order to avoid embarrassment. Thirdly, they may realize that they have sinned, but are not willing to repent and confess their sin.

How can Christians be forgiven of sin that was committed in ignorance [has not been brought to their attention]? If we sin in ignorance while striving to live in harmony with the will of God, then the blood of Christ continues to cleanse us as indicated in 1 John 1:7, "But if we walk in the light as He is in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus Christ His Son cleanses us from all sin." Walking in the light includes the living sacrifice described in Rom. 12:1-2, "I beseech you therefore, brethren, by the mercies of God, that you present your bodies a living sacrifice, holy, acceptable to God, which is your reasonable service. And do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind, that you may prove what is that good and acceptable and perfect will of God." A necessary part of the Christian growth process is the renewing of the mind by the Word of God in order to eliminate sin that previously was not recognized as sin. If a Christian sins in ignorance while striving to live in harmony with the will of God, and it isn't brought to his or her attention, it isn't necessary or appropriate to make the statement: "If I've done anything wrong, I repent".

Christians must grow in the knowledge of God's Word, and when they become aware of sin in their life, they must repent of their sin and ask God's forgiveness.

Mature Christians have an important part to play in the growth process of less mature Christians: "Brethren, if a man is overtaken in any trespass, you who are spiritual restore such a one in a spirit of gentleness" (Galatians 6:1). A Christian who has the spiritual maturity to do so should gently make other brethren aware of their trespasses and thereby help restore them. Ultimately it is the responsibility of each individual Christian to know and to do God's will. As Paul stated in 2 Thessalonians 1:12, we pray "that the name of our Lord Jesus Christ may be glorified in you, and you in Him, according to the grace of our God and the Lord Jesus Christ".
