CHRISTIANITY vs ATHEISM

The Campbell-Owen debate of 1830 is a most significant one because the two greatest men of both sides took part in this discussion. Robert Owen, a wealthy philanthropist, was in his hay-day at that time as the most outstanding skeptic. Perhaps we best know him for his socialistic experiment in America--New Harmony, Indiana. Alexander Campbell was well known for his able defence of Christianity

A few months before the debate Owen visited Brother Campbell on his farm near Bothany,

Virginia. As they strolled along the rolling green hills of the farm, Owen made the statement, "There is one advantage I have over Christians-- I am not afraid of death. Most Christians have fear in death, but if some items of my business were settled, I should be perfectly willing to die." Brother Campbell answered, "You say you have no fear in death; have you any hope in death? After a prolonged silence, the philosopher said that he did not. Campbell then pointed to an ox grazing in the field and answered, "Then you are on a level with that brute. He has fed till he is satisfied, and stands in the shade whisking off flies, and has neither hope nor fear in death."

Only can the faithful Christian have hope in death. "If in this life only we have hope in Christ, we are of all men most miserable." (I Cor. 15:19) DEB
