"Learning from the Past: Dealing with Adversity"

Through the centuries some folks have had the mistaken idea that Christians are immune to any kind of adversity. Some have said that if you have trials and hardships in your life that God is missing from your life. But the Bible heroes of the past have always had to deal with adversity. Those heroes would include people like **Noah**, **Abraham**, **Sarah**, **Job**, **Moses**, **Jeremiah**, **Daniel**, **Peter and Paul**. While we may not have had the same type of adversity as them, we have all had our own share of those things in our life that cannot be called anything else but adversity. You may not have actually faced lions in their own den but have experienced the need to rely on God to bring you safely through a life-threatening experience. You may not have been beaten and left for dead, but have been falsely accused and/or your life threatened in some way. Most of us have experienced the need to come to grips with adversity and face it head on.

Nebuchadnezzar told Daniel, "Your God, whom you serve continually, He will deliver you." When the ordeal was over Daniel told Nebuchadnezzar, "My God sent His angel and shut the lions' mouths', so they have not hurt me because I was found innocent before Him, and also, O King, I have done no wrong before you." (Daniel 6:16, 22) Paul wrote in Romans 12:9-21 a little treatise on dealing with adversity. He concludes it with, "Be not overcome with evil, but overcome evil with good." (Romans 12:21)

As we learn from the past we need to remember this teaching from the past, "Trust in the Lord with all your heart, and lean not on your own understanding." (Proverbs 3:5) We can learn from the past about how to deal with adversity.

ELDERS CORNER

WHY CHRISTIANS WORSHIP ON THE FIRST DAY OF THE WEEK

The children of Israel observed many holy days including the Sabbath day, the seventh day of the week, which was commanded by God through Moses. The keeping of these holy days and the commandments to remember the Sabbath day was given only to the Israelites (Exodus 31:16, 17). Christians have never been commanded to keep the Jewish Sabbath nor any of their holy days.

The Bible speaks of two covenants. God made the first covenant with Abraham, and gave his law through Moses, which would govern his people. This time was known as the Mosaic Dispensation. This dispensation continued until Christ came and died on the cross, at which time this first covenant was fulfilled. Christ took it out of the way, nailing it to the cross (Col. 2:14).

The second covenant was given by Christ and came into effect after his death, as any will (covenant) is of no effect while the testator (author) liveth (Heb. 9:17). This period of time is known as the Christian Dispensation, and the law that governs God's people now, (Christians), was given by Jesus Christ.

The night before Jesus was crucified, He instituted the Lord's Supper, instructing His apostles to partake of it whenever they met, in remembrance of Him. After His church was established on the Day of Pentecost which was on the first day of the week, we read of the apostles and other members of the early church meeting on the first day of the week to partake of the Lord's Supper (Acts 20:7). Christians worship God every day of the week, but on Sunday, the first day of the week, is the day Christians meet, partake of the Lord's Supper, give as God has prospered them, exhorting and having fellowship with one another (Heb. 10:25).
