CRITICIZED FOR COMPASSION

Jesus came into this world to seek and to save the lost (Luke 19:10). He made salvation possible for the lost by His death (Colossians 1:14). While, His work of saving souls involved His sacrifice, and His teaching, it also included other tremendous acts of compassion (Matthew 9).

Jesus healed a paralyzed man, and forgave him of his sins (Matthew 9:1-6). Jesus was accused of being a blasphemer on this occasion. Not long after that, Jesus called a tax collector to follow Him, and ate among tax collectors (Matthew 9:9-13). He was criticized for this also. It was then that He replied, "those who are well have no need of a physician" (Matthew 9:12).

Jesus healed the woman with the flow of blood disease (Matthew 9:18-21), then raised the daughter of the ruler from the dead (Matthew 9:22-26). Jesus then healed some blind men, after which He cast a demon out of another man (Matthew 9:27-33). The Pharisees criticized Jesus and accused Him of casting demons out by the power of the ruler of the demons (Matthew 9:34).

Jesus kept on teaching, preaching, and healing, despite all of the criticisms and attack (Matthew 9:35). The people He taught and healed, were lost, scattered, and confused spiritually. Jesus had compassion on them, viewing them as sheep without a shepherd (Matthew 9:36-37).

So much love, concern, kindness, and compassion coming from the Divine for His creation. Yet, so any from among the created complained, criticized, and condemned. This did not stop Jesus from doing good. This did not bring an end to his preaching, teaching, and healing. If we are criticized for doing good, we must be like the Lord and keep on doing good.

ASSEMBLY

Let's go clue hunting. We will collect the clues, put them together, and draw some conclusions. The first clue is found in Hebrews chapter ten and verse twenty-five. God speaks of a required assembly in this passage. A collection of saints was expected. This collection/assembly was not to be forsaken. To forsake the assembly would mean to turn our back on it and walk away from it. Don't abandon the assembly, for to do so is to abandon your fellowship with God and His people.

Hebrews ten speaks of a required assembly, but it does not tell us when that assembly took place. We must look elsewhere in the New Testament to find some more clues about this assembly. There are two passages that talk about Christians regularly assembling on a particular day (Acts 20:7; 1 Corinthians 16:1-2). The passage in the first letter to Corinth literally tell us this took place every first day of the week. So, let's put the first two clues together and see what we have. We have a required assembly of Christians on the first day of every week.

Let's look now for some clues as to what they did when they assembled on the first day of the week. Hebrews 10:25 speaks of the Christians exhorting one another. Acts 20:7 speaks of the Christians listening to preaching and braking bread together. 1 Corinthians 16:1-2, speaks of the Christians giving for the work of the church.

The expression, "brake bread," in Acts 20:7; could refer to the eating of any meal, but it could also refer to the eating of a special meal. When we consider 1 Corinthians 11, we conclude this was a special meal. In fact, it was the Lord's Supper, 1 Corinthians 11:17-34 speaks of the Christians assembling together. In fact, the idea of them "coming together" is repeated numerous times throughout the passage. There was something bad happening at the Corinth assembly. They were abusing the Lord's Supper. But, the abuse of a practice doesn't make the correct use of the practice wrong. Paul corrects the practice in the context. Here is reminds them of how the Lord's Supper is actually to be observed. So, let's put our clues together. The early Christians were not to forsake the assembly that took place upon the first day of the week, at which time they exhorted one another through preaching, partaking of the Lord's Supper, and giving.

Are there more clues? Sure. 1 Corinthians 14 speaks of a worship service. This service included the use of miraculous gifts. We don't have miraculous gifts today (1 Corinthians 13:8-13). But, we do have worship today. The early Christians engaged in singing and praying in their worship service (1 Corinthians 14:15).

Let's put all the clues together and see if we can get a picture of first century Christian worship. There was an assembly for worship that was required (Hebrews 10:25). That assembly took place on every first day of the week (Acts 20:7; 1 Corinthians 16:1-2). When they assembled, they worshipped God by listening to preaching, by engaging in singing, praying, partaking of the Lord's Supper, and by giving (Acts 20:7; 1 Corinthians 11:17-34; 14:15; 16:1-2).
