"Where Are the Nine?"

Jesus said, "where are the nine?" (Luke 17:17.) They had left the scene of action. They were gone. Being insensitive to the goodness of Christ they failed to give thanks and to glorify God. Jesus knew where they were but the question as to their whereabouts serves to point up the fact of ingratitude.

The apostle Paul declared, "Giving thanks always for all things unto God and the Father in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ." (Ephesians 5:20.) That we aught to be thankful is of itself a sufficient and ultimate answer to the question why we should give thanks.

All my adult life I have been taught to be grateful for the people who have worked in the movement to restore New Testament Christianity. Some men, now gone to their reward, have been absolutely great in making contributions to the Cause of Christ. They have brought the church to us and they have left a legacy of material that is of invaluable assistance to those of us who preach the gospel. It is a sign of goodness in the life of a preacher to give credit where credit is due. The apostle Paul declared, "Honor to whom honor is due." (Romans 13:7.) Every gospel preacher should be thankful for the men who have labored on behalf of the church. John said, "that they may rest from their labors and their works do follow them." (Revelation 14:13.)

Recently, I had occasion to talk with some of the young men who have been employed by the church to preach the gospel. There seems to be the idea expressed by one preacher when he said, "I don't need McGarvey's commentary on the book of Acts." Brother McGarvey's expertise in dealing with that great history of the church is not useful to him. This young man may be a great preacher but he would be more effective if he were a student of J. W. McGarvey. A number of preaching brethren are rejecting the scholarship of the brotherhood. "Where are the nine?"

The late H. A. Dixon was an able defender of the faith. All praise to his memory. In an article entitled "A New Breed of Preachers" he declared, "The gap idea originated outside of the church but it has been brought into it. The emphasis upon it indicates that many do not know about the stalwarts who in the past have contended worthily for the faith and who with dedicated spirits have given reason for their hope against all who would challenge them. This group is not aware of what these battles have meant. In them they have overlooked that Paul needed a Timothy and Timothy needed a Paul, that

older men needed younger men and the younger men needed to learn from and profit by the guidance of those who had experience. This is true in family, community, and national life or in the church of God and it accords with the teaching of God's word."

One young man, with unusual talent as a public speaker, said, "I don't need the New Testament commentaries written by our brethren in order to preach the gospel." This is indicative of a trend among us. It is apparent that some of our brethren have forgotten that our principal business is to restore New Testament Christianity. We have the suspicion that when the scholarship of the brotherhood is rejected that something is wrong.

We need to join hands with those who have fought so valiantly in the restoration movement. Shall we lose all that has been wrought? Many of our problems involved in the work could be eliminated if our preaching were distinctive. The apostle Paul declared, "And even things without life giving sound, whether pipe or harp, except they give a distinction in the sounds, how shall it be known what is piped or harped? For if the trumpet give an uncertain sound, who shall prepare himself for battle?" (1 Corinthians 14:7-8.) Timothy was to "fight the good fight of faith." (1 Timothy 6:12.) But the responsibility, while specifically given to Timothy, is binding upon all of us who profess to follow Christ. It is impossible for soldiers of the cross to "fight a good fight of faith" when the voice in the pulpit is an "uncertain sound." "Who shall prepare himself for battle?"

It is a well-known fact that the preachers who were the pioneers in the Restoration Movement were experts in the field of distinctive preaching. It is always safe for a preacher to be found in the company of those who, with great respect for the authority of Christ, combine intelligence and an ability to impart information. It is better to keep company with persons rather above than below one's self. Why should a preacher of the gospel rely upon some writer who has a reputation for leadership in the denominational world? Who has excelled Brother McGarvey with a written commentary on the book of Acts? What writer deals with the Holy Spirit in a way commensurate with Brother H. Leo Boles?

It is not the purpose of this writer to deny that a preacher needs a library composed of many books. Commentaries, by Adam Clarke and Albert Barnes are examples of useful works in the hands of a careful student. But if the gospel preacher is to study books and profit by the guidance of those who had experience, it is necessary to study the books written by scholarly men who devoted their lives to the Cause of Christ.
