HE CARES FOR YOU

God cares for you. Consequently, God desires to help you. However, God will not help those who are arrogant. "Therefore,. Humble yourselves under the mighty hand of God, that He may exalt you in due time, casting all your care upon Him, for he cares for you" (1 Peter 5:6). Sometimes, proud people demand that God help them. They go to God in prayer, or ask others to pray on their behalf, even while they stubbornly and arrogantly refuse to live in obedience to God. God may love them, but He is not going to help them until they humble themselves before Him.

Peter encouraged us to humble ourselves before God and then cast our cares upon God (1 Peter 5:6). It is interesting to see that Peter spoke of the "mighty hand of God" in this verse. We humble ourselves before God because he is mighty and we are not. We cast our cares upon God because He is mighty and we are not. God has infinite power and might. There is not anything He cannot do for us. Whatever trouble we face, He can help us endure. Whatever we need, He can provide for us.

In recognition of the mighty power of God, we humble ourselves before Him and then cast our cares upon Him. You may have noticed the text says, "casting **all** your cares upon Him" (1 Peter 5:6). There is not a problem we have that we should not give to God. Every single difficulty we face must be something we take humbly before God in prayer. God is the

One that you can tell all of your struggles to. He is the One that you can rely upon with full trust. He has told us to cast all of our cares upon Him. Let us not hesitate to do so.

We humble ourselves before God because He is mighty and we are not. We humble ourselves under the mighty hand of God so that we may cast all of our cares upon Him. We cast all of our cares upon Him. We cast all of our cares upon Him because He is mighty, and also because “He cares for you” (1 Peter 5:6). Sin is such an affront to the holy, perfect, and pure nature of God that we are deserving of immediate death (Genesis 2:16-17; Romans 3:23). Though we have rebelled against God in our sin, God still cares for us. He cares for us enough to help us when we humble ourselves under His mighty hand, and when we cast all of our cares upon Him. It may be hard to fathom the God of the universe actually caring for you individually, but Peter assured us that He does. What greater comfort can there be? We know that we can cast our cares upon God because He cares. He is interested in us. He wants to help us. We are unworthy of the love and care of God and yet He wants to help us anyway.
