 - d. be teachers of good
 - e. train the young women
3. The younger women should:
 - a. love their husbands
 - b. love their children
 - c. be sober-minded
 - d. be chaste
 - e. be workers at home
 - f. be kind
 - g. be in subjection to their husbands
4. The younger men should:
 - a. be sober-minded
 - b. show a good example in good works
 - c. show uncorruptness, gravity and sound speech in teaching
