ELDERS CORNER:

Christmas: Holy Day or Holiday?

Some of the most popular motto's of the latter part of December are, "Let's keep Christ in Christmas" or "Jesus: the reason for the season." As a Christian do those statements disturb you? Frankly, they do me. Now before anyone goes jumping to the wrong conclusion, let me say this. I grew up in a home where Christmas was celebrated, a tree was erected [sometimes real and sometimes artificial], family gathered, gifts were exchanged, and great quantities of food were consumed. Yet through it all, none of us believed we were celebrating the birth of Jesus Christ. It was to us, and for that matter still is, a non-religious holiday.

But the question still lingers in the minds of many, "Can Christians observe Christmas?" My first response when confronted with that question is, "Observe it as what?" Now I recognize that there are those who reject Christmas entirely, even as a non-religious holiday. They don't erect a tree, exchange gifts, or anything else connected with December 25 as a holiday. Be that as it may, my understanding is that:

"This word (Christmas) was not coined until the eleventh century – a thousand years after our Lord came to Earth" and that "the word no longer conveys its exclusive earlier meaning, signifying to many of us no more than a holiday." 1

With this I agree and in addition I offer the following from Webster:

December 25, now generally observed as a legal holiday and an occasion for exchanging gifts, greetings" 2

So the answer to the question posed earlier is yes, Christians may observe Christmas as a non-religious holiday without violating any Biblical principle.

It is true that as early as the fourth century A.D. December 25 was being observed as the birth of Christ. However, the fact that a thing has long been practiced does not justify it or make it right.

Our rejection of Christmas as a holy day is argued along these lines.

First, the exact date and season of the birth of Jesus Christ is unknown. What we do know is that the birth of Jesus took place at a time when shepherds were "abiding in the field, keeping watch over their flock by night" (Luke 2:8). Is it not then reasonable to conclude that this describes a season more nearly comparable to Spring? Some think so. One reference volume offers this valuable thought:

"But why set the date in the winter? The shepherds would have been least likely to tend their flocks on the hillsides at that time. More likely, Jesus was born in the fall or spring." 3

But the final word must remain that our Lord's specific birthdate [His incarnation] is unknown.

Second, Scripture seems to lay less stress on the birth of Jesus, than on what was accomplished by His death, burial, and resurrection. Please don't take that as an attempt to diminish the gift of love that brought Jesus into this world (John 1:14; 3:16; Romans 5:8; 2 Corinthians 8:9), it is not! We readily recognize that the virgin birth of Jesus, and the place of that birth, is a matter of prophecy (Isaiah 7:14; Micah 5:2). But the fact remains that the death, burial, and resurrection of Jesus is the very heart and soul of the gospel message (1 Corinthians 15:1-4).

What we are to "celebrate" [if we may use that term], is our Lord's **death** on the cross for the sins of the world (2 Corinthians 5:21), in our partaking of the Lord's supper every first day of the week (Acts 20:7; 1 Corinthians 11:24-26). In regard to His **burial**, we recognize that it was participated in by us when we were buried with Him in baptism (Romans 6:4). And we continue to focus on that event as we reflect on our obedience to Christ and the demands of the Christian life (Colossians 3:1-3). Likewise, His **resurrection** which was on the first day of the week (Luke 24:1-5) is remembered by us as we assemble up-on that day from week to week.

Never do the Lord's people want to take away from any Scriptural truth. But neither do we desire to elevate a Biblical fact beyond its intended purpose. The way in which our world celebrates Christmas as a holy day does not coincide with Scripture and we are not obliged to follow. The Christians motto is not, "keep Christ in Christmas" but rather "Christ in you, the hope of glory" (Colossians 1:27).
